## Visitor Center and Aquariums

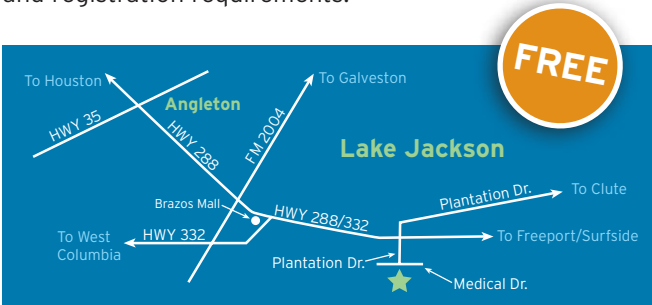
Come explore a variety of saltwater aquariums showcasing Texas sea life. The centerpiece of the exhibits is a 50,000-gallon Gulf of Mexico aquarium. A 20-foot touch pool allows visitors to gently touch marine animals such as blue crabs, hermit crabs and anemones. Other aquarium exhibits include a Salt Marsh, Coastal Bay, Jetty and Artificial Reef.

## Marine Fish Hatchery

Home of the largest redfish hatchery in the world, Sea Center Texas has the capacity to produce up to 15 million juvenile redfish and spotted seatrout each year. The fish produced at the hatchery are released into Texas bays to enhance natural populations and improve recreational fishing. Guided hatchery tours are available by calling or emailing for a reservation prior to your visit.

## Wetland Walkway and Other Activities

Other exhibits include a wetland walkway and replicas of Texas state record saltwater fish. The facility has several opportunities for catch-and-release fishing for youth and hosts other special events and programs throughout the year. Check the website for details and registration requirements.
