



How to georeference an observation in iNaturalist (adding location information to an observation)

Step 1: While viewing the observation, click "Edit"



Step 2:

Type in the location (which you've already done), but notice that there are no coordinates or accuracy numbers in the box below the location. Also notice the very large circle of error (accuracy) :



Step 3: Click on the map to show where you found the critter, then drag the edges of the circle inward to show how sure you are of the location. When there are numbers in the lat/long and numbers in the accuracy, your observation is now georeferenced
