## **2:45 – 5:15 pm      DEER ANATOMY AND DIET - Optional On-Site Workshop**

Ever wondered why a deer just did a certain behavior? Or had your child ask “what is that?” as they pointed while you dressed your deer? Are you interested in learning more about white-tailed deer from the outside in? Please join us after the general workshop for this special “hands-on” deer biology training. Using actual deer carcasses, we’ll discuss general deer anatomy, both external and internal, focusing on special adaptations, the function of various internal organs, and commonly seen external parasites. Learn how the deer’s 4-part stomach works and what deer eat. Discuss the breeding season, timing, biochemical cues, deer behavior, and see how to age fawns to determine when rut occurs on your property. Take a look at teeth and get the scoop on aging deer by teeth wear. Ask the experts all your white-tailed deer questions. Instructors are wildlife biologists with Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept.







**From North:** You can take FM 1960 west. FM1960 becomes Hwy 6. OR Take I-45 or Hwy 59 south to the Sam Houston Parkway (Tollroad) or Beltway 8 (free). Take the SHP west until you reach Hwy 290. Take Hwy 290 West toward Austin. Exit Hwy 6. Turn left (south) on Hwy 6. Pass several main streets. Pass Clay Rd. Pass Keith Harrow Rd. Turn left (east) on Patterson Rd. Turn left on Bear Creek Drive. Extension office is on your left with large parking lot.

**From East:** Take I-10 west through downtown Houston, continue until you get to Hwy 6. Exit on Hwy 6 and turn right (north) on Hwy 6. Cross bridge. At Patterson Rd., turn right (east). Turn left on Bear Creek Rd. Extension office is on your left with large parking lot.

**From South:** Take Hwy 59 or 288 north to Hwy 6. Exit Hwy 6 and go west. Pass I-10. Turn right (east) at Patterson Rd. Turn left on Bear Creek Rd. Extension office is on your left with large parking lot.

**From West:** Take I-10 to Hwy 6. Exit Hwy 6 and go north on Hwy 6. Turn right (east) on Patterson Rd. Turn left on Bear Creek Rd. Extension office is on your left with large parking lot.
