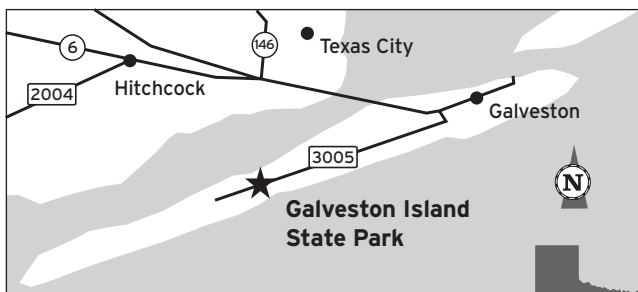

Sunshine, surf and sand combine to create one of the state's most popular places — Galveston Island State Park on the Gulf Coast. Here, visitors can choose from a variety of activities, such as swimming, fishing, hiking and birdwatching. Anglers can try their luck along the shore, bayous and coves, or cast a line for freshwater species in the park's ponds. Birders will appreciate observation platforms and blinds along the nature trail.

-  **Camping:** 150 campsites with water and electricity. Ten screened shelters.
-  **Group Facilities:** Group camp with 20 electric sites and pavilion (capacity 75).
-  **Picnicking:** Picnic tables with shade shelters and grills.
-  **Swimming:** At your own risk on the beach. Bathhouse.
-  **Fishing:** Excellent fishing and crabbing along the shore, bayous and coves.
-  **Birdwatching:** Over 300 species recorded.
-  **Trails:** Self-guided, four-mile nature trail includes observation platforms and boardwalks.
-  **Texas State Parks Store:** Unique items, books, etc.
