Your purchase supports angler education for youth and adults, fish stocking, and habitat restoration.

A valid fishing license is required for people ages 17 and older to take fish, mussels, clams, crayfish or other aquatic life in the public waters of Texas.

Protect fish and fish habitats:

- · Use barbless or circle hooks.
- · Play and land the fish quickly.
- · Use wet hands to handle the fish.
- Properly dispose of litter and recycle fishing line.
- Give away your unused live bait or dispose in a trash can (do not return to waterway).



EASY ACCESS FISHING SPOTS IN THE SAN ANTONIO METRO AREA



1. Millers Pond, San Antonio

- Bank fishing access; no boats or swimming allowed. The park has picnic tables, portable restroom, a playground, lighted jogging track and team sports facilities.
- Part of TPWD's Neighborhood Fishin' program and stocked with trout in winter and catfish in summer.
- From San Antonio, take I-35 South to Loop 410. Merge right onto Loop 410. Exit Old Pearsall Road. Lake will be on your left at 6075 Old Pearsall Road.

2. Espada Park Lake, San Antonio

- Good bank access; no boats or swimming allowed. Picnic tables, restrooms and a jogging track are located in the park.
- Look for entrance on SE Military Drive (Loop 13) between Roosevelt Ave. and S. Presa Street.

3. South Side Lions Park Pond, San Antonio

- Excellent, shaded bank access; no boats or swimming. The park offers picnic tables, restrooms, a playground and a jogging track. Three pavilions are available by reservation.
- Part of TPWD's Neighborhood Fishin' program and stocked with trout in winter and catfish in summer.
- From I-10 east of downtown, exit Pecan Valley Drive south to Southside Lions Park. From I-37, exit Southcross Blvd., go east and turn left on Pecan Valley.

4. Braunig Lake, San Antonio

- This power plant reservoir has a boat ramp and excellent bank access. Picnic areas, primitive camping, restrooms, boat rentals and concessions are available in the park. One day-use fee covers both Braunig and Calaveras lakes.
- Take exit 130 from I-37 South.

5. Calaveras Lake, San Antonio

- Power plant reservoir with boat ramp and bank access, with picnic areas, camping, restrooms, boat rentals and concessions in the park. One day-use fee covers both Braunig and Calaveras lakes.
- Take I-37 south to U.S. 181 east, turn northeast on Loop 1604 and take Stuart Road to park.

6. Brackenridge Park, San Antonio River

(Trout stocking)

- Good bank access. This well-developed park offers picnic areas, restrooms, covered pavilions and many other services.
- From I-37/McAllister Freeway, take Hildebrand east to north park entrance or Mulberry east to south entrance.

7. Live Oak City Lake, Live Oak

- Good bank access; no boats or swimming. Picnic tables, restrooms, covered pavilions and team sports facilities are available in the park.
- Located just east of I-35 in the City of Live Oak. Take Toepperwein Road south to Narrow Pass, turn right on Lone Shadow and left on Lazy Forest.

8. Lake Dunlap, New Braunfels

- Boat ramp and limited bank access;
 no other facilities.
- Take I-35 north to City of New Braunfels. Ramp is on north bank of Guadalupe River directly below the bridge.

o. Lake Placid, Seguin

- Boat ramp and limited bank access;
 no other facilities.
- Take I-10 east to Exit 605. The ramp is located under the bridge.

10. Canyon Lake, Comal County

- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Comal County operate more than a dozen parks on this lake. Most parks have boat ramps, bank fishing access, picnic areas and campgrounds. Some are closed at certain times of the year; contact the Corps for current information.
- Take I-35 north to the City of New Braunfels and exit west on FM 306 to reach lake area. Parks are located in various communities around the lake shore.

11. St. Mary's Elmendorf Lake Park, San Antonio

- This park has some small shelters, several picnic tables, restrooms, walking trail, playscape and a pond. Fishing is allowed from the banks.
- The park's address is 3700 W. Commerce. From downtown San Antonio, exit from I-10/I-35 onto W. Commerce. The park is between Zarzamora and 24th.

12. Woodlawn Lake Park, San Antonio

- This park has athletic fields, swimming pool, restrooms, playscapes, walking trails and a fishing pier. The pond is stocked about once a year with catfish.
- The park is at 1103 Cincinnati Ave. From down-town San Antonio take I-10 /Hwy. 87 west, exit onto W. Woodlawn Ave. and go west, turn left on Wilson and left on Cincinnati.

13. Patrolman John Randolph Wheeler Park,

San Antonio

- This small park has few amenities 3 picnic tables, some benches, walking trail and pond with fishing.
- The park's address is 10239 Ingram Rd. From San Antonio, take I-10 North to Loop 410 West, exit Ingram Rd. The park is west of Loop 410 on Ingram.

14. Earl Scott Pond, in the Leon Creek Greenway,

San Antonio

This pond is within the greenway and requires someone to walk a short distance to it from Rohde Park at the Buddy Calk Trailhead. There are no amenities at the pond.

15. Guadalupe River State Park, Spring Branch

- The park has bank access to the Guadalupe River with camping and picnic areas and restrooms. Entrance fee.

- From San Antonio, drive northwest on I-10 to Boerne, turn right (east) on Texas Hwy. 46, then left (north) on State Park Road P31 to the park.

16. Fischer Park Pond, New Braunfels

- Fischer Park has hiking trails, two fishing ponds with bank access and a small pier, playgrounds, etc.
- From I-35 in New Braunfels, head east on S. Seguin Ave./725, turn right on E. County Line Rd., then right on McQueeney Rd. The park will be on your left.
