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SECTION I – GENERAL INFORMATION AND STATEMENT OF WORK

1. INTRODUCTION

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) is soliciting bids to establish a blanket contract(s) for Archeological Services for the Wildlife Management Areas, State Parks, and Private Lands of Texas as per the following scope of work.

2. BACKGROUND

TPWD owns and operates 50 Wildlife Management Areas, 89 State Parks, and conducts activities on private lands throughout the state. Many of the activities TPWD conducts on these properties involve compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and/or the Antiquities Code of Texas. Periodically, TPWD requires assistance in meeting the agency's obligations under these laws and their accompanying regulations and is seeking proposals from interested firms to provide the agency with historical and archeological services

3. SOLICITATION METHOD AND INTENT

- 3.1. The Request for Proposal (RFP) solicitation method allows qualified respondents to submit a written proposal addressing pricing, qualifications, experience, location, availability, approach and other factors that will be employed to ensure successful accomplishment of the requirements set forth herein. TPWD will review, compare and evaluate responses based on the criteria and weights identified in this RFP and award a blanket contract(s) to the highest-ranking respondents.
- 3.2. To ensure the ability to accommodate variable schedules and special conditions, it is TPWD's intent to award multiple contracts, as determined to be in the best interest of TPWD. Award of individual projects will be based on best value, location, and availability of Contractor to perform services. It is TPWD's sole discretion to determine best value. See Section I, Subsection 4 for contractor selection for individual projects.

4. CONTRACTOR SELECTION FOR INDIVIDUAL PROJECTS

- 4.1. As specific projects are identified, TPWD will develop a project Scope of Work and select a contractor for each project by one of the following methods: (a) select Contractor based on "low price" and contractor's availability, or; (b) request project quote from one or more awarded Contractor(s) for a specific project. TPWD will evaluate responses and select a contractor that is determined to provide the best value to the agency.
- 4.2. Contractor(s) may be required to conduct site inspection prior to submitting quote/response for a specific project
- 4.3. TPWD will issue a Purchase Order with a detailed work order for each assigned project to the selected Contractor(s), to include, but not limited to, the following documentation:
 - 4.3.1. Map showing areas to be treated.
 - 4.3.2. Scope of Work
 - 4.3.3. Project Schedule
 - 4.3.4. Payment Schedule

5. CONTRACT TERM

- 5.1. Initial Contract Term: The contract shall commence on Date of Award and continue through August 31, 2024 unless sooner terminated under the terms of the contract.
- 5.2. Renewal Option: Contract may be renewed for up to three (3) additional one (1) year periods, provided both parties agree in writing prior to contract expiration date. Any extensions shall be in accordance with the original terms and conditions plus any approved changes. *If renewal options are exercised, TPWD will provide the new timeline and delivery schedule to the vendor.*
- 5.3. Contract Extensions: In the event that the contract(s), if any, resulting from the award of this RFP shall terminate or be likely to terminate prior to the making of an award for a new contract for the identified products and/or services, TPWD may, with the written consent of the awarded supplier(s), extend the contract for a period of time as may be necessary to permit TPWD continued supply of the identified products and/or services (not to exceed twelve month extension period). Any extensions shall be at the same terms and conditions, plus any approved changes.
- 5.4. Termination: The contract shall terminate upon full performance of all requirements contained in the contract, unless otherwise extended or renewed, as provided in accordance with the contract terms and conditions.
- 5.5. Amendments: The contract may be amended in writing by mutual consent of the parties.
- 5.6. Quantities: Unless this RFP states otherwise, the resulting contract award does not guarantee volume or a commitment of funds.

6. QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- 6.1. Minimum Qualifications and Experience: Respondent (and awarded contractor) shall meet the following minimum qualifications:
 - 6.1.1. Shall be engaged in the business of providing archeological services for a *minimum* of five (5) years. Recent start-up businesses do not meet the requirements of this solicitation. (A start-up business is defined as a new company that has no previous operations history or expertise in the relevant business and is not affiliated with a company that has that history of expertise.)
 - 6.1.2. Shall have available the necessary qualified personnel, skills, qualifications as defined by the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards for Archaeology and Historic Preservation (36 CFR Part 61) Must also possess the organization, facilities, equipment and supplies required to fulfill all requirements under this RFP and any resulting contract. In addition, the respondent's proposed Principal Investigator must be able to obtain a Texas Antiquities Permit from the Texas Historical Commission during the term of this contract and any subsequent amendments.
 - 6.1.3. Respondent to submit with proposal response, the required exhibits and other supporting documentation that clearly demonstrates their ability and capability to successfully complete the services described herein.
 - 6.1.4. Shall be in good financial standing. TPWD reserves the right to request a copy of the respondent's audited or un-audited financial statement.

- 6.2. **Supporting Documentation:** Respondent shall complete and submit *Exhibit E – Company Profile, Exhibit F – Key Personnel, Exhibit G – Past Projects with Corresponding References*, with proposal to provide documentation to support the above qualifications. (Ref: *Section II, Subsection 3.2.*)

7. SCOPE OF WORK AND SPECIFICATIONS

- 7.1. Contractor shall provide professional archeological and historic preservation services on TPWD properties and managed private lands statewide to assist TPWD in complying with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and the Antiquities Code of Texas.
- 7.2. All services requested will be supervised by qualified individuals who meet the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards (36 CFR Part 61). For archeological services the supervising individual will meet the professional qualifications for an archeologist, while historic structure investigations the supervising individual will meet the professional qualifications for an architectural historian or historic architect.
- 7.3. The types of services requested may include but not necessarily limited to: (1) archeological research design development and Texas Antiquities Permit applications; (2) terrestrial archeological surveys; (3) archeological monitoring; and (4) historic structure evaluations

7.3.1. Archeological Research Design and Texas Antiquities Permit Application- Each archeological field investigation conducted on state lands will require the contractor to obtain a Texas Antiquities Permit. This task will initially involve a review of records and applicable publications necessary to develop a research design commensurate with the level of investigation to be undertaken. For terrestrial archeological surveys the focus of the research design will be on identifying and evaluating all historic properties that could be affected by the project. For testing projects, the research design will focus on defining research questions that can help determine whether the site is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Preservation (NRHP) and/or for official designation as a State Antiquities Landmark (SAL). Monitoring projects research designs will serve more as monitoring protocols, focusing on the field methodology of identifying and recording cultural deposits or features in relation to sediment deposits and/or soil formation. All research designs will generally include: (1) a project description (provided by TPWD); (2) a review of geologic, soil, and TxDOT PALM data as they relate to the occurrence and the depositional context of potential archeological sites; (3) a review of the THC Archeological Sites Atlas as it relates to previous investigations and recorded archeological sites; (4) background research conducted at the TPWD Archeology Lab, unless otherwise stipulated; and (5) a description of the area-of-potential-effect (APE) and the methodology used consistent with the Council of Texas Archeologists Terrestrial Survey Standards (CTA Standards) to identify historic properties within the area-of-potential-effect (APE). All research designs will be accompanied by a Texas Antiquities Permit application which will be submitted to TPWD for review and comment. All comments on the research design will be addressed to the satisfaction of TPWD before submission to the THC for permit issuance. All recovered artifacts will be processed in accordance with the TPWD Archeology Lab standards and will be permanently curated at the TPWD Archeology Laboratory. In addition, the successful bidder will adhere to the TPWD Human Remains Policy (Section 13).

7.3.2. Terrestrial Archeological Surveys- The purpose of a terrestrial archeological survey is to identify and assess all historic properties including cemeteries and unmarked burials that could be affected by a proposed project. This will start with the development of a research design (See 5.2.1 above). Methods used for Terrestrial Archeological Surveys will follow the CTA Standards and will include: (1) the visual inspection of the ground surface along designated transect intervals that are spaced no more than 30-meters apart; (2) the inspection and documentation of all ground surface exposures, erosional profiles, and areas of previous ground disturbance; (3) the excavation of exploratory shovel tests and/or mechanical auger tests to identify subsurface archeological deposits and/or to demonstrate that a sufficient level of subsurface investigation was conducted to identify

all historic properties affected; (4) in areas where deeply buried archeological deposits could potentially occur, backhoe trenching should be used; (5) the confirmation of isolated finds and the delineation of site boundaries within the extent of TPWD property, particularly if those boundaries extend beyond the limits of the APE; and (6) all sites revisited that have not been delineated in accordance with current CTA Standards, the contractor will include this effort as well. The contractor will also be responsible for completing and submitting a TexSite 3.0 electronic site data for all new sites recorded and for sites revisited.

Terrestrial Archeological Surveys will be documented with field notes, shovel test logs, backhoe trench profile descriptions, photograph logs, and positional information taken with a ~1-meter accuracy GNSS Global Positioning System. Field notes will contain general information on transect intervals, numbers of subsurface tests excavated by landform type, reason why excavation of subsurface tests were terminated, and reasons why the survey deviated from the approved research design. At a minimum shovel test logs will include a soil profile description for each subsurface test (Munsell soil color, texture, and thickness), depth and description of artifacts recovered, and a reason that each shovel test was terminated. Photographs will be taken of all surface exposures, profile exposures, areas of previous ground disturbance, a sample of shovel and auger tests, all features, backhoe trench profiles, and at least two area shots of archeological site encountered. At a minimum the photographic log will include an image number, image description, and direction. The locations of all shovel/auger tests, backhoe trenches, surface/vertical exposures, and disturbed areas will be collected with a GPS. All artifacts will be collected with respect to their specific horizontal and vertical provenience.

- 7.3.3. National Register and/or State Antiquities Landmark Testing - In certain situations, TPWD may ask the contractor to conduct archeological investigations to evaluate the NHRP eligibility and/or SAL status of a particular site or sites. It is anticipated that an investigation of this type would require the contractor to develop a research design detailing the field and analysis methods used to evaluate and make conclusive recommendations regarding the NRHP eligibility and/or formal SAL designation. The specific methods used in the evaluations will depend on the specific resource, but may include: trenching to identify archeological features; hand unit and small block excavations; shovel testing and auger testing to confirm site boundaries; remote sensing (i.e. ground penetrating radar, resistivity, magnetic susceptibility, aerial drone photography, etc.) to identify and assess archeological features; geoarchaeological studies to determine the depositional integrity of archeological deposits; the collection and analysis of radiocarbon and floatation samples, and any additional studies required to fully assess the site's eligibility for listing on the NRHP and/or for formal SAL designation in accordance with 36 CFR 60 and 13 TAC Part 2 Chapter 26 respectively.
- 7.3.4. Archeological Monitoring- The contractor may be asked to provide archeological monitoring services to monitor project construction activities for archeological deposits. Methods used during monitoring will involve the inspection of all ground disturbing activities for archeological deposits and the documentation and evaluation of those deposits should they be located. Documentation of archeological deposits shall involve the vertical and horizontal exposure of archeological features and screening of sediments in the near vicinity of such finds to recover associated artifacts. Archeological features will be geolocated using 1-meter accuracy GNSS GPS, photographed and sketched in plan and profile, and narrative data will be collected. Special samples such as feature fill and radiocarbon samples will be collected as appropriate. The contractor will be expected to evaluate the integrity of archeological deposits encountered and make recommendations for further treatment. Data for each archeological site encountered will be entered into the THC TexSite 3.0 database, and an electronic version will be submitted to TPWD following fieldwork.
- 7.3.5. Historic Structure Evaluations- The contractor may be asked to evaluate standing structures, by establishing whether they are historic in age (45 years or older). TPWD will provide any records available to assist the contractor in establishing the historic age of the structure(s); however, the contractor will be expected to gather and review any additional data/records (i.e. historic maps and

aerials) required to substantiate the age of structures. The contactor may be required to conduct an on-site inspection of historic aged structures to document their integrity and conduct additional records research necessary to evaluate whether structures could be considered eligible for listing on the NRHP or for formal designation as SAL.

8. DELIVERABLES

- 8.1. All documents resulting from each individual work authorization must be submitted to the Regional Cultural Resources Coordinator or Wildlife Division Cultural Resources Coordinator and copied to Aina Dodge (aina.dodge@tpwd.state.tx.us) at the TPWD Archeology Lab. This includes the following deliverables:
- 8.1.1. Antiquities Permit Application, including research design and project area map, signed by the Cultural Resources Program Director/Wildlife Cultural Resources Coordinator, or designee
 - 8.1.2. Antiquities Permit
 - 8.1.3. Antiquities Permit extension (where applicable)
 - 8.1.4. Any default notification letters from THC
 - 8.1.5. Cover letter that accompanied draft report to THC
 - 8.1.6. THC response to draft report
 - 8.1.7. Cover letter that accompanied 2nd draft report to THC (where applicable)
 - 8.1.8. Cover letter that accompanied final report to THC
 - 8.1.9. TPWD Contract (where applicable)
 - 8.1.10. Screen capture showing that Texas Contract Archeology Form was submitted
 - 8.1.11. Completed Permit letter from THC
 - 8.1.12. Any other correspondence from THC or other regulatory agency not otherwise noted herein
- 8.2. All deliverables must be submitted to the Regional Cultural Resources Coordinator or Wildlife Division Cultural Resources Coordinator. All deliverables listed below will be submitted both as electronic files. All text should be in Microsoft Word, all tables in Microsoft Excel, all images in high-resolution (300 DPI), and all GPS shapefiles and/or geodatabase compatible with ArcGIS software.
- 8.2.1. THC Coordination Letter (if applicable) – The contractor may be required to prepare a coordination letter (one electronic copy) that summarizes the project, the results of the record search, presents the study findings, and provides SAL and NRHP recommendations.
 - 8.2.2. Draft Report - A single, edited, MS Word file of the draft report (double-spaced) that contains a description of the project, the results of the record search, research design, methods used during the course of the investigation, present the study findings, and provide SAL and NRHP recommendations.
 - 8.2.3. An electronic version of the THC TexSite 3.0 database for each site recorded or revisited during the course of the investigation. A jpeg or pdf and shapefiles showing site boundaries.
 - 8.2.4. Final Report: digital copy in MS Word and tagged PDF formats (may be submitted electronically), and 20 bound copies with maps of restricted information in pocket of back cover on 10 of these copies. This number of reports does not include the required publications for the designated repositories as mandated by the Antiquities permit requirements. The contract archeologist will forward those copies to the individual repositories.
 - 8.2.5. GIS maps and files (ArcGIS shapefiles in UTM coordinates, using NAD83 datum, submeter accuracy, and contain relevant, identifiable attribute data) and computerized photo log and databases, including artifact inventory, special sample logs, and shovel test results.

- 8.2.6. Project records, maps, artifacts, photographs, and other materials prepared in accordance with the TPWD Archeology Lab Director.
- 8.2.7. The draft report will be submitted to TPWD cultural resources coordinator (CRC) for technical review. The CRC will review and provide comments on the draft report to the contractor. When the draft is acceptable it will be forwarded to the THC. If the THC has comments on the draft report or requires supplemental information, TPWD will forward those to the contractor to address. Upon completion of the final draft review process, the final report will follow the same channels. It will first go to the CRC who will then send it to the THC.
- 8.3. Report Specifications – These specifications are complimentary of and/or in addition to guidelines established in the Council of Texas Archeologists Guidelines for Cultural Resource Management Reports (<https://www.thc.texas.gov/public/upload/CTAguidelines.pdf>). All reports and consultation letters for investigations on TPWD or private lands described in Item 6.2 above must include:
- 8.3.1. The name of the group or agency conducting the investigation and identification of personnel involved
 - 8.3.2. Title of report must include the type of undertaking, and the name of the WMA or Private Land that the undertaking took place
 - 8.3.3. An explanation of the reasons for undertaking the investigation
 - 8.3.4. A description and explanation of the area of potential effect
 - 8.3.5. A description of the area investigated
 - 8.3.6. Total acres investigated/surveyed/metal detected
 - 8.3.7. A map of the TPWD property or Private Land and its place in Texas as well as the project area covered by the investigation
 - 8.3.8. A description of the goals and priorities that structured the investigation
 - 8.3.9. All changes to the agreed Scope of work, project goals, and/or priorities will require consultation with the TPWD WMA cultural resources coordinator.
 - 8.3.10. Number of person-days spent in the field and dates of fieldwork
 - 8.3.11. Number of shovel tests, backhoe trenches, metal detecting divots, and/or excavation units dug
 - 8.3.12. An explanation of how and why locations of shovel tests and/or excavation units were selected, i.e., whether they were random, systematic, or judgmental
 - 8.3.13. If no subsurface testing was conducted, a statement explaining why
 - 8.3.14. A discussion of all disturbances in the project area; environmental and cultural
 - 8.3.15. A discussion of the previous investigations and previously recorded sites in the project area
 - 8.3.16. A discussion of the survey methods (including transect intervals); for excavations (shovel tests, metal detecting divots, and excavation units), state size, maximum depth, levels, and screening techniques
 - 8.3.17. A detailed discussion of the soils in the project area as defined by a soils expert; Technical Expert must provide soil's expert's credentials upon request.
 - 8.3.18. A complete list of the sites and cultural resources identified
 - 8.3.19. A discussion and description of the specific sites or properties found for each context
 - 8.3.20. For all recorded sites—a discussion of natural features such as rivers, bluffs, hills, vistas and views, paths, focal points, edges and any other elements which define a site's character
 - 8.3.21. A discussion of all materials discovered and/or recovered
 - 8.3.22. For all state or private owned sites—recommend State Archeological Landmark (SAL) designation. Give specific criteria, as described in Section 26.1 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure for the Antiquities Code of Texas. If SAL designation could not be determined,

state what is needed to make that determination, e.g., mechanical testing, additional excavation units, more shovel testing. State why those investigations were not conducted, e.g., beyond the scope of the contract, too costly, site extends out of project area. Explain whether a site warrants listing in the NRHP. Specify criteria for how those determinations were made. Also, be specific about what aspect of the site is evaluated. For example, if the archeological deposits of a historic homestead site are determined ineligible, but the structural integrity of the associated buildings remain unevaluated, this should be stated clearly.

- 8.3.23. An explanation of how the sites and site boundaries were defined
- 8.3.24. Final recommendations.
- 8.3.25. Information on the location of the collection and the records.
- 8.3.26. References Cited
- 8.3.27. All reports will include supporting figures and tables. At a minimum, supporting figures include: topographic maps showing project APE; a topographic map(s) showing all subsurface excavations; for any sites recorded or revisited topographic maps showing site boundaries and locations of subsurface tests (i.e. shovel tests) used in boundary delineation, and at least two photographic area views of each site; and if backhoe trenches are excavated, figures showing trench profiles or a composite profile graphic. At a minimum, supporting tables will include a list of shovel tests showing shovel test number, soil description by zone and thickness, cultural materials by level recovered, and a reason why shovel test excavation was terminated.
- 8.3.28. All reports must follow the Society for American Archaeology (SAA) style guide https://documents.saa.org/container/docs/default-source/doc-publications/style-guide/saa-style-guide_english_updated_2021_final08023c15928949dabd02faafb269fb1c.pdf?sfvrsn=c1f41c1b_2
- 8.3.29. **If investigations pertain only to a historic site then the Society for Historic Archaeology style guide must be followed** <https://sha.org/publication-links/>
- 8.3.30. **The Author(s), not TPWD, is responsible** for the content of their report, for the accuracy of quotations and correct attribution, for the legal right to publish any material submitted and the appropriate handling of issues of co-authorship, and for submitting their manuscripts in the proper form for publication. The Author(s) is responsible for submitting a legible, edited document. If the edits of a submitted document appear to be extensive, the draft will be returned without review until the edits have been completed. Deliverables for individual work authorizations may include agency coordination letters, draft and final reports, and artifacts and records for curation.

9. CONTRACTOR REQUIREMENTS

- 9.1. Contractor agrees to conduct all its services under the awarded contract by and through appropriate communications with TPWD. No work, installation or other services shall be undertaken by Contractor except with the prior written authorization by TPWD. Contractor understands and agrees that work, installation or other service performed without prior written authorization of the TPWD is work outside the scope of this contract and shall be performed exclusively at Contractor's risk.

- 9.2. Contractor shall provide service in accordance with requirements specified herein and the resulting contract(s) and adhere to the TPWD Terms and Conditions.
- 9.3. Contractor shall provide all labor, materials and equipment necessary to meet requirements of the specified services throughout the term of the contract.
- 9.4. Contractor is responsible for all costs incurred in the performance of the contract.
- 9.5. Contractor shall comply with all laws, ordinances, statutes and regulations pertaining to the services requested herein, and shall obtain such permits, licenses or other authorizations as may be required.
- 9.6. Contractor shall follow relevant safety rules and conduct the work in a safe manner.

10. TPWD RESPONSIBILITIES

- 10.1. TPWD will designate a Project Manager(s) or a designee and Contract Manager(s) upon contract award.
- 10.2. TPWD will furnish no material, labor, equipment, or facilities unless otherwise provided for in this contract.

11. ADDING NEW PRODUCTS/SERVICES TO CONTRACT AFTER AWARD

Following the contract award, additional products/services of the same general category that could have been encompassed in the award of this contract, and that are not already on the contract, may be added. A formal written request will be sent to successful respondent to quote on the proposed additional products/services. Respondent shall submit proposals to TPWD as instructed. All prices are subject to negotiation with the Best and Final Offer ("BAFO"). TPWD may accept or reject any or all proposals and may issue a separate solicitation for the products/services after rejecting some or all of the responses. The products/services covered under this provision shall conform to the specifications as outlined in the request.

12. MODIFICATIONS OF CONTRACT TERMS AND/OR AMENDMENTS

- 12.1. The terms and conditions of the Contract shall govern all transactions under the Contract.
- 12.2. The Contract may only be modified or amended upon mutual written agreement of TPWD Purchaser(s) and the Contractor.
- 12.3. Terms and conditions that do not conflict with the Contract and are acceptable to the Contractor(s) may be added in a Purchase Order and given effect. No additional term or condition added in a Purchase Order can conflict with or diminish a term or condition of the Contract. In the event of a conflict between Purchase Order and the Contract, the Contract term shall control.

13. TPWD TREATMENT OF HUMAN REMAINS POLICY

- 13.1. **PURPOSE:** TPWD staff are responsible for the identification and protection of human remains and/or associated funerary objects on lands owned or controlled by TPWD. The purpose of this policy is to comply with state and federal laws while honoring the sanctity of those individuals whose remains rest in or on TPWD lands, as well as, to provide direction to TPWD staff if the discovered human remains are potentially forensic and/or criminal in nature.

This policy is in accordance with the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA), [25 USC §§3001 et seq.](#); [43 CFR §10.1-10.17](#); [Natural Resources Code, Chapter 191](#) (the Antiquities Code of Texas); [Health and Safety Code, Chapter 711](#) (General Provisions Relating to Cemeteries); and [13 Texas Administrative Code \(TAC\) §26.27](#) (Memorandum of Understanding between Texas Historical Commission and TPWD).

- 13.2. **BACKGROUND:** Treatment of human remains and/or associated funerary objects requires respect for the deceased and for the places where humans have been buried, as well as, sensitivity to the beliefs of genetic and cultural descendants. Additionally, it is critical that TPWD assist local law enforcement in protecting the integrity of potential evidence and crime scenes.

TPWD established [Procedures for Treatment of Human Remains and/or Funerary Objects](#), which set standards for treatment of all types of human remains.

13.3. DEFINITIONS

- 13.3.1. [Archeological](#)- relating to the scientific study of historic or prehistoric peoples and cultures through analysis of the artifacts and evidence they left behind.
- 13.3.2. [Associated Funerary Objects](#)- items which, as a part of the death rite or ceremony of a culture, are reasonably believed to have been placed with or near individual human remains either at the time of death or later.
- 13.3.3. [Forensic](#)- relating to or denoting the application of scientific methods and techniques to the investigation of a crime.
- 13.3.4. [Human Remains](#)- the body of a deceased person, in whole or in parts, regardless of the stage of decomposition or manner of death. Human remains include but are not limited to, bones, teeth, hair, ashes, or mummified or otherwise preserved soft tissues of a person of any ancestry and associated with any time period.

13.4. POLICY STATEMENT

- 13.4.1. Every effort must be made to preserve and protect human remains and associated funerary objects located on lands owned or controlled by TPWD in their original place of discovery or burial. It is the intent of TPWD to avoid any damage or disturbance to human remains and associated funerary objects, and to secure and protect any remains and potential crime scenes discovered on TPWD lands.
- 13.4.2. [When Human Remains are Discovered](#): If human remains (forensic or archeological) are discovered on TPWD lands, whether as a result of natural or artificial forces, or during the course of an activity, the [Procedures for Treatment of Human Remains and/or Funerary Objects](#), must be followed. Any discovery of remains should be treated as a crime scene until determined otherwise.

13.4.3. When Removal of Human Remains is Necessary

- 13.4.3.1. The removal of human remains from TPWD lands may require a court order from the Texas District Court for the county in which the remains are located, and a Disinterment Permit from the Texas Department of State Health Services.
- 13.4.3.2. If human remains are determined to be forensic, the removal process will be determined by the appropriate local law enforcement agency and Medical Examiner/Coroner's Office.
- 13.4.3.3. If the State Parks Cultural Resources Program Director determines that archeological human remains and/or associated funerary objects must be removed from TPWD lands, they will be retrieved using care and respect. Removal will take place under the direction of the Cultural Resources Program staff after consultation with the appropriate federally recognized tribes and the TPWD Legal Division.
- 13.4.3.4. Once removed from the ground, archeological human remains and/or funerary objects are to be treated according to the stipulations of NAGPRA. The Cultural Resources Program Director will ensure compliance with NAGPRA and all applicable state laws before, during, and after removal.

14. PERFORMANCE MEASURES

- 14.1. Contractor will be responsible for the performance of any contractual obligations that may result from an award based on this RFP and shall not be relieved due to non-performance of any or all subcontractor(s). By submitting a proposal, the Respondent commits to providing the goods and services required in the RFP. The successful Respondent(s) will be required to abide by TPWD policies, procedures, standards, and guidelines relevant to the execution of this contract.
- 14.2. TPWD will measure and evaluate the Contractor's and/or subcontractor's performance under the contract. If the Contractor or subcontractor does not meet any standards for deliverables and/or performance incentives (if applicable), TPWD may impose remedies if the Contractor or subcontractor(s) fails to meet their responsibilities as outlined in the RFP and the terms and conditions of the contract. All services and deliverables under the contract shall be provided at an acceptable quality level and in a manner consistent with acceptable industry standards, customs, and practices. In the event TPWD deems that the Contractor's performance does not meet an acceptable quality level of service and deliverables, TPWD may seek or negotiate remedies with the Contractor.

15. PRICE ADJUSTMENTS

- 15.1. Extension Period Pricing: A price escalation may be allowed for hourly rate sheet upon renewal provided the vendor notifies TPWD Purchasing and Contracting Branch, in writing. The price escalation shall correlate with The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). Baseline index shall be the index published the month of award. Prices may be adjusted for each renewal period in accordance with changes in index over the preceding term. Failure to comply with these instructions may be grounds for disallowance of a price escalation as allowed herein.
- 15.2. Price Decreases: Price decreases will be allowed at any time. Contractor shall apply price decreases as soon as practicable following their determination. Any price reductions passed on to other customers shall be correspondingly offered at the same ratio to TPWD. Contractor's failure to promptly notify TPWD of

such industry-wide price decreases may constitute a breach of contract and the contract may be canceled. TPWD reserves the right to award any canceled contract to the next lowest responsive respondent or re-bid, whichever is in TPWD’s best interest.

- 6.8. AWARD: TPWD reserves the right to award a contract to a single contractor, or award to more than one contractor, whichever provides the best value to TPWD in performance of this service. TPWD will be the sole judge of best value. (Refer to *Section III, Item 3.3* for Best Value criteria.)

SECTION III – GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

(ITEMS BELOW APPLY TO AND BECOME A PART OF THE CONTRACT)

Any Contract awarded as a result of this solicitation will contain the General Terms and Conditions listed below in this Section. Subcontractors are also obliged to comply with these provisions.

1. **DEFINITIONS:** As used throughout this solicitation, the following terms have the meaning set forth below. All other terms have the meaning set forth in Webster's II New College Dictionary.
 - 1.1. **Contractor:** The individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, or organization that has to furnish the materials and has to perform the work as stated in the solicitation.
 - 1.2. **ESBD:** The Electronic State Business Daily, which is available online at <http://www.txsmartbuy.com/esbd>.
 - 1.3. **Gov't Code:** The Texas Government Code.
 - 1.4. **Owner:** Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, an agency of the State of Texas.
 - 1.5. **Party/Parties:** Either the TPWD and Respondent separately or collectively.
 - 1.6. **Respondent:** Any person or Vendor who submits a Bid/Proposal/Offer in response to this solicitation.
 - 1.7. **Services:** Includes the use of labor, materials, facilities, equipment, and any other need that is necessary or incidental to the successful completion of the Contract.
 - 1.8. **Subcontractor:** Any supplier, distributor, Contractor, person, or firm furnishing to the Contractor, materials or services necessary or incidental to the performance of the Contract between TPWD and Contractor.
 - 1.9. **TAC:** The Texas Administrative Code, which is the publication for administrative rules.
 - 1.10. **Texas Identification Number:** A unique 11-digit number assigned by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts. When a Payee first contracts with a state agency, that Payee must provide either a federal Employer Identification Number (EIN) or a Social Security number (SSN). The Texas Identification Number (TIN) is based on this number. (Note: If Respondent does not have a TIN, or does not know their TIN, they may list their EIN or SSN on the "Texas Identification Number" line of the Vendor Information Block of their RFP, RFO, IFB or RFQ response.)
 - 1.11. **TPWD:** Texas Parks and Wildlife Department acting on behalf of the State of Texas.
2. **SPECIFICATIONS:**
 - 2.1. The goods/services provided shall be in accordance with the purchase specifications herein. TPWD will decide the answers to all questions that may arise as to the interpretation of the specifications and the quality, or acceptability of goods/services provided. TPWD will decide the rate of progress of the work and the acceptable fulfillment of the goods/service on the part of the Contractor.
 - 2.2. Catalogs, brand names or manufacturer's references are descriptive only, and indicate type and quality desired. Bids/Proposals on brands of like nature and quality will be considered unless advertised under Texas Gov't Code §2155.067. If the Respondent is offering brands other than the references, response should show manufacturer, brand or trade name, and other description of product offered. If Respondent is offering brand(s) other than brand(s) specified, illustrations and complete description of product offered are requested to be made part of the bid. Failure to take exception to specifications or reference data will require Respondent to furnish specified brand names, numbers, etc.

- 2.3. Unless otherwise specified, items shall be new and unused and of current production.
- 2.4. Samples, when requested, must be furnished free of expense to the State. If not destroyed in examination, they will be returned to the Respondent, on request, at Respondent's expense. Each sample should be marked with Respondent's name and address, and requisition number. Do not enclose in or attach response submission to sample.
- 2.5. The State will not be bound by any oral statement or representation contrary to the written specifications of this Solicitation.
- 2.6. Manufacturer's standard warranty shall apply unless otherwise stated in the solicitation.

3. AWARD OF A PURCHASE ORDER: Standard Purchase Order Terms and Conditions apply. If a conflict exists between the standard Purchase Order Terms and Conditions and specific language in this solicitation, the language in the solicitation shall prevail.

- 3.1. A response to a solicitation is an offer to Contract with TPWD based on the terms, conditions and specifications contained in the solicitation. Responses do not become Contracts unless and until they are accepted through an authorized TPWD designee by issuance of a Purchase Order.
- 3.2. This procurement will be conducted in accordance with the State Purchasing Act, Title 10, Subtitle D, Chapters 2151 through 2177, of the Texas Gov't Code (TGC) and TPWD rules. Any Contract resulting from this procurement shall consist of one (1) document. This document will contain all of the rights and duties of the parties extracted from the relevant terms and conditions of this solicitation (including its attachments, exhibits, supplements, and addenda); the successful Contractor's response; any TPWD request for a Best and Final Offer; and any successful Contractor's Best and Final Offer, if applicable.
- 3.3. Best Value – TPWD will be the sole judge of best value. Award will be based on Best Value criteria and may include, but is not limited to:
 - 3.3.1. Best meets the goals and objectives of the solicitation as stated above.
 - 3.3.2. Best meets the quality and reliability of the proposed services.
 - 3.3.3. Effect of the proposed solution on agency productivity.
 - 3.3.4. Provides the most customer focused solution that will best meet the needs of the public.
 - 3.3.5. Experience in successfully providing services in this solicitation.
 - 3.3.6. Past Performance: A Respondent's past performance will be measured based upon pass/fail criteria in compliance with applicable provisions of Gov't Code §§2155.074, 2155.075, 2156.007, 2157.003, and 2157.125. Respondents may fail this selection criterion for any of the following conditions:
 - The Vendor has a score less than C or Legacy Unsatisfactory in the Vendor Performance System,
 - Currently under a Corrective Action Plan through the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts (CPA),
 - Having repeated negative Vendor Performance Reports for the same reason,
 - Having Purchase Orders that have been cancelled in the previous 12 months for non-performance (i.e., late delivery, etc.).

In addition to evaluating performance through the Vendor Performance Tracking System (as authorized by 34 Texas Administrative Code §20.115), CPA may examine other sources of vendor performance including, but not limited to, notices of termination, cure notices, assessments of liquidated damages, litigation, audit reports, and non-renewals of Contracts. Any such investigations shall be at the sole

discretion of CPA, and any negative findings, as determined by CPA, may result in non-award to the Respondent.

4. **UNIT PRICES:** Respondents must price per unit shown. Unit prices shall govern in the event of extension errors.
5. **FREIGHT:** Quote FOB destination, freight prepaid and allowed unless otherwise stated within the specifications.
6. **DELIVERY:**
 - 6.1. Show number of days required to place material in receiving agency's designated location under normal conditions. Delivery days mean calendar days, unless otherwise specified. Failure to state delivery time obligates Respondent to deliver in 14 calendar days. Unrealistic delivery promises may cause solicitation to be disregarded.
 - 6.2. If delay is foreseen, Contractor shall give written notice to the TPWD. Contractor must keep the TPWD advised at all times of status of order.
 - 6.3. Default in promised delivery (without accepted reasons) or failure to meet specifications authorizes the TPWD to purchase supplies elsewhere and charge full increase, if any, in cost and handling to defaulting Contractor.
 - 6.4. **Substitutions:** No substitutions permitted without written approval of TPWD.
 - 6.5. Delivery shall be made during normal working hours only unless prior approval has been obtained from ordering agency. Normal working hours are 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM Monday through Friday except State and National holidays.
7. **TESTING AND INSPECTION:**
 - 7.1. TPWD may test and inspect goods and services purchased under the Contract to ensure compliance with the specifications of this solicitation and the Contract. TPWD may also test and inspect goods and services before they are purchased under the Contract. Authorized TPWD personnel shall have access to the Respondent's place of business for the purpose of inspecting the goods. To the extent practical, TPWD inspections will not disrupt the Respondent's daily operations. Tests shall be performed on samples submitted with the Bid/Proposal or on samples taken from regular shipments. All costs of testing and inspection shall be borne by the Respondent. In the event the goods tested fail to meet or exceed all conditions and requirements of the solicitation and Contract, the goods will be rejected in whole or in part, at the State's option, and returned to the Respondent or held for disposition at the Respondent's expense. Latent defects may result in cancellation of the Contract at no expense to the state.
 - 7.2. If material fails to meet specifications, the Respondent will be notified by fax, mail, or e-mail. The Respondent will have ten (10) working days after receipt of the notification to remove the rejected material from state property. Material will be removed at the Respondent's expense. Material not removed in the allotted time period will be disposed by TPWD. The Respondent will be charged for all disposable expenses conducted by TPWD.
8. **CHANGES:** TPWD may at any time, by a written order, make changes within the general scope of this Contract, in the definition of services to be performed, and the time (i.e., hours of the day, days of the week, etc.) and place of performance thereof. If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for the performance of any part of the services under this Contract, whether changed or not changed by any such order, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Contract price or time of performance or both and the Contract shall be modified in writing accordingly. Any claim by the Contractor for adjustment under this clause must be asserted within 30 days from the date of receipt by the Contractor of the notification of change, provided, however, that TPWD, if it decides that the facts justify such action,

may receive and act upon such claims asserted at any time prior to final payment under this Contract. Failure to agree to any adjustment shall be a dispute concerning a question of fact within the meaning of the clause of this Contract entitled "Dispute Resolution."

9. INVOICING AND PAYMENT:

- 9.1 Invoices: In order to receive payment under the Contract, the Contractor must submit an original invoice to TPWD, which will be designated in the Purchase Order as the "Bill To" address. To be a proper invoice that may be accepted and paid, the invoice must include the following information and/or attachments: (1) Name and address of the Contractor. (2) The Contractor's Texas Identification Number (TIN). (3) The Contractor's invoice remittance address. (4) The Purchase Order number authorizing the delivery of products or services. (5) A description of what the Contractor delivered, including, as applicable, the time period, serial number, unit price, quantity, and total price of the products and services. If the invoice is for a lease, the Contractor must also include the payment number (e.g., 1 of 36).
- 9.2 Disputed Invoices: As stated above, the Contractor will receive notice of an error in an invoice submitted for payment by not later than the 21st day after the date the invoice was received by the TPWD. If an invoice dispute is resolved in favor of the Contractor, the Contractor is entitled to receive interest on the unpaid balance of the invoice, beginning on the date the invoice became overdue, pursuant to Gov't Code §2251. 021. If a dispute is resolved in favor of the TPWD, the Contractor shall submit a corrected invoice that must be paid in accordance with Section 2251.021. The unpaid balance accrues interest if the corrected invoice is not paid by the appropriate date.
- 9.3 Time and Manner of Payment: Pursuant to Texas Gov't Code Chapter 2251, payment by TPWD is overdue on the 31st day after the later of: (1) the date the TPWD receives the goods under the Contract; (2) the date the performance of the service under the Contract is completed; or (3) the date the TPWD receives the invoice for the goods or service. Payment by a political subdivision Customer whose governing body meets only once a month or less frequently is overdue on the 46th day after the later event of: (1) the date TPWD receives the goods under the Contract; (2) the date the performance of the service under the Contract is completed; or (3) the date TPWD receives the invoice for the goods or service.

- 10. PATENTS, TRADEMARKS, OR COPYRIGHTS: Respondent agrees to defend and indemnify the TPWD and State from claims involving infringement or violation of patents, trademarks, copyrights, trade secrets, or other proprietary rights, arising out of the TPWD's or the State's use of any good or service provided by the Respondent as a result of this solicitation.**
- 11. PROHIBITION ON LOBBYING: The Respondent shall comply with the provisions of a federal law known generally as the Lobbying Disclosure Act, 2 U.S.C. §1601 et seq. By submitting a Bid/Proposal, the Respondent certifies that it shall not and has not used federally appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence any officer or employee of any federal agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any federal Contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. §1352. It also certifies that the Respondent shall disclose any lobbying with non-federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any federal award by completing and submitting Standard Form LLL.**
- 12. ANTI-TRUST AND ASSIGNMENT OF CLAIMS: The undersigned affirms under penalty of perjury of the laws of the State of Texas that (1) in connection with this Response, neither I nor any representative of the Respondent have violated any provision of the Texas Free Enterprise and Antitrust Act, Tex. Bus. & Comm Code Chapter 15; (2) in connection with this Response, neither I nor any representative of the Respondent have violated any federal antitrust law; and (3) neither I nor any representative of the Respondent have directly or indirectly communicated any of the contents of this Response to a competitor of the Respondent or any other company, firm, partnership or individual engaged in the same line of business as the Respondent. The successful Contractor hereby assigns to TPWD, any and all claims for overcharges associated with any contract resulting from this solicitation which arise under the antitrust laws of the United**

States 15 U.S.C.A., Section 1, et seq. (1973), and which arise under the antitrust laws of the State of Texas, Texas Business and Commercial Code Ann. Sec. 15.01, et seq. (1967).

13. **DEBTS AND DELINQUENCIES:** As required by Gov't Code §2252.903, the Respondent agrees that any payments due under the Contract shall be directly applied towards eliminating any debt or delinquency is has to the State of Texas including, but not limited to, delinquent taxes, delinquent student loan payments, and delinquent child support.
14. **DISPUTE RESOLUTION:**
 - 14.1. The dispute resolution process provided for in Chapter 2260 of Texas Gov't Code and TPWD regulations shall be used by TPWD and the Respondent to resolve all disputes arising under this Contract. The Contractor shall comply with such rules, as revised from time to time.
 - 14.2. If the Contractor's claim for breach of Contract cannot be resolved informally with TPWD, it shall be submitted to the negotiation process provided in Chapter 2260. To initiate the process, the Contractor shall submit written notice, as required by Chapter 2260. The notice shall also be given to the individual identified in the Contract for receipt of notices. Any informal resolution efforts shall in no way modify the requirement or toll the timing of the formal written notice of a claim for breach of Contract required under § 2260.051 of Texas Gov't Code. Compliance by the Contractor with Chapter 2260 is a condition precedent to the filing of a contested case proceeding under Chapter 2260.
 - 14.3. The contested case process provided in Chapter 2260 is the Contractor's sole and exclusive process for seeking a remedy for an alleged breach of Contract by TPWD if the Parties are unable to resolve their disputes as described above.
 - 14.4. Compliance with the contested case process provided in Chapter 2260 is a condition precedent to seeking consent to sue from the Legislature under Chapter 107, Civil Practices and Remedies Code. Neither the execution of the Contract by TPWD nor any other conduct of any representative of TPWD relating to the Contract shall be considered a waiver of sovereign immunity to suit.
 - 14.5. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Contract to the contrary, unless otherwise requested or approved in writing by TPWD, the Contractor shall continue performance and shall not be excused from performance during the period any breach of Contract claim or dispute is pending under either of the above processes; however, the Contractor may suspend performance during the pendency of such claim or dispute if the Contractor has complied with all provisions of Gov't Code §2251.051, and such suspension of performance is expressly applicable and authorized under that law.
15. **FRAUD, WASTE, AND ABUSE:** By submitting a Response to this Solicitation, the Respondent represents and warrants that it has read and understood and shall comply with CPA's Anti-Fraud Policy, found at: <https://comptroller.texas.gov/about/policies/ethics.php>, as such Policy currently reads and as it is amended throughout the term of the Contract.
16. **NAME CHANGES AND SALES:**
 - 16.1. If the Contractor changes its name or is sold to another entity, it must provide written notification to TPWD. The Contractor, in its notice, shall describe the circumstances of the name change or sale, state its new name, provide the new Tax Identification Number, and describe how the change will impact its ability to perform the Contract. If the change entails personnel changes for personnel performing the responsibilities of the Contract for the Contractor, the Contractor shall identify the new personnel and provide resumes to TPWD, if resumes were originally required by the Solicitation. TPWD may request other information about the change and its impact on the Contract and the Contractor shall supply the requested information within five (5) working days of receipt of the request.

- 16.2. TPWD may terminate the Contract due to a sale of or change to the Contractor that materially alters the Contractor's ability to perform under the Contract. The TPWD has the sole discretion to determine if termination is appropriate.

17. CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 17.1. Contractor agrees to comply with all terms and conditions contained in this solicitation and resulting Contract.
- 17.2. Contractor guarantees services offered will meet or exceed the written specifications identified in this solicitation.
- 17.3. Permits: Contractor shall be responsible, at the Contractor's expense, for obtaining any and all permits or licenses required by city, county, state, or federal rules, regulations, law, or codes that pertain to the Contract.
- 17.4. Electrical Items: All electrical items provided by the Contractor to TPWD under the Contract must meet all applicable OSHA standards and regulations, and bear the appropriate listing from UL, FMRC, or NEMA.
- 17.5. Executive Head: Pursuant to Gov't Code §669.003, the TPWD may not enter into a contract with a person who employs a current or former Executive Head of a state agency until four years have passed since that person was the executive head of the state agency. By submitting a Proposal, the Respondent certifies that it does not employ any person who was the Executive Head of a state agency in the past four years. If Section 669.003 applies, Respondent shall complete the following information in order for the response submission to be evaluated:

- 17.6. Contractor agrees to take precautions necessary to protect person or property against injury or damage and be responsible for such injury or damage.
- 17.7. Contractor agrees to comply with Federal law or State Worker's Compensation laws which are applicable to the work required or performed under this Contract and to pay or cause to be paid all compensation, medical or hospital bills which may become due or payable thereunder, and to protect and indemnify TPWD from and against any and all liability by reason of injury to employees of Contractor or subcontractor.
- 17.8. Contractor shall provide all labor, equipment, and materials (unless otherwise stated herein) necessary to furnish the goods or perform the service. All employees of the Contractor shall be a minimum of 17 years of age and experienced in the type of work to be performed. Only the Contractor and its employees will be allowed on state property during working hours.

- 18. **TERMINATED CONTRACTS:** By submitting a Response, the Respondent certifies that it has not had a Contract terminated or been denied the renewal of any Contract for non-compliance with policies or regulations of any state or federally funded program within the past five (5) years nor is it currently prohibited from contracting with a governmental agency. If the Respondent does have such a terminated Contract, the Respondent shall identify each and provide an explanation for the termination.

- 19. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:** The Contract shall not render the Contractor an employee, officer, or agent of the TPWD for any purpose. The Contractor is and shall remain an independent Contractor in relationship to the TPWD. The TPWD shall not be responsible for withholding taxes from payments made under the Contract. The Contractor shall have no claim against the TPWD for vacation pay, sick leave, retirement benefits, social security, worker's compensation, health or disability benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, or employee benefits of any kind.
- 20. RIGHT TO AUDIT / RECORDS RETENTION:** Under Section 2262.154 of the Texas Gov't Code, the State Auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of any entity receiving funds from the state directly under any Contract or indirectly through a subcontract under the Contract. The acceptance of funds by the Contractor or other entity or person directly under the Contract or indirectly through a subcontract under the Contract acts as acceptance of the authority of the State Auditor's Office, TPWD or any successor agency, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. Under the direction of the legislative audit committee, the Contractor or other entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation by the State Auditor must provide the State Auditor with access to any information the State Auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit. Contractor shall ensure that this paragraph concerning the State's authority to audit funds received indirectly by subcontractors through Contractor and the requirement to cooperate is included in any subcontract it awards. Contractor shall maintain and retain supporting fiscal and any other documents relevant to showing that any payments under these Contract funds were expended in accordance with the laws and regulations of the State of Texas, including but not limited to, requirements of the Comptroller of the State of Texas and the State Auditor. Contractor shall maintain all such documents and other records relating to this Contract and the State's property for a period of seven (7) years after the date of submission of the final invoices or until a resolution of all billing questions, whichever is later. Contractor shall make available at reasonable times and upon reasonable notice, and for reasonable periods, all documents and other information related to the work of this Contract. Contractor and the subcontractors shall provide the State Auditor with any information that the State Auditor deems relevant to any investigation or audit. Contractor must retain all work and other supporting documents pertaining to this Contract, for purposes of inspecting, monitoring, auditing, or evaluating by TPWD and any authorized agency of the State of Texas, including an investigation or audit by the State Auditor. Contractor shall cooperate with any authorized agents of the State of Texas and shall provide them with prompt access to all of such State's work as requested. Contractor's failure to comply with this Section shall constitute a material breach of this Contract and shall authorize TPWD and the State of Texas to immediately assess appropriate damages for such failure.
- 21. FORCE MAJEURE:** Neither Respondent nor TPWD shall be liable to the other party for any delaying, or failure of performance, of any requirement in the Contract caused by force majeure. The existence of such causes of delay or failure shall extend the period of performance until after the causes of delay or failure have been removed, provided the non-performing party exercises all reasonable due diligence to perform. Force majeure is defined as acts of God, fire, explosions, hurricanes, floods, epidemics, or pandemics, national or regional emergency, failures of transportation, or other causes that are beyond the reasonable control of either party and that by exercise of due foresight such party could not reasonably have been expected to avoid, and which, by the exercise of all reasonable due diligence, such party is unable to overcome. The burden of proof for the need of such relief shall rest upon the Contractor. To obtain release based on force majeure, the Contractor shall file a written request with TPWD reasonably promptly from the time the force majeure event occurs.
- 22. PROPRIETARY OR CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION; TEXAS PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT:**
- 22.1. Any proprietary, trade secret or otherwise confidential information Respondent includes in its Proposal must be clearly labeled as proprietary or confidential information, and Respondent must identify the specific exception to disclosure in the Public Information Act (PIA). Merely making a blanket claim the entire Proposal is protected from disclosure because it contains some proprietary information is not acceptable and shall make the entire Proposal subject to release under the PIA. In order for TPWD to initiate the process of seeking an Attorney General opinion on the release of proprietary or confidential information, the specific provisions of the Proposal that are considered

by the Respondent to be proprietary or confidential must be clearly labeled as described herein. Any information which is not clearly identified as proprietary or confidential shall be deemed to be subject to disclosure pursuant to the PIA.

- 22.2. Information, documentation, and other material in connection with this Response or any resulting Contract may be subject to public disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act, Chapter 552 of the Texas Gov't Code.
- 22.3. Contractor is required to make any information created or exchanged with the state pursuant to this Contract, and not otherwise excepted from disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act, available in a format that is accessible by the public at no additional charge to the state.

23. RIGHT TO DATA, DOCUMENTS AND COMPUTER SOFTWARE (STATE OWNERSHIP): Any software, research, reports studies, data, photographs, negatives or other documents, drawings or materials prepared by Contractor in the performance of its obligations under this Contract shall be the exclusive property of the State of Texas and all such materials shall be delivered to the State by the Contractor upon completion, termination, or cancellation of this Contract. Contractor may, at its own expense, keep copies of all its writings for its personal files. Contractor shall not use, willingly allow, or cause to have such materials used for any purpose other than the performance of Contractor's obligations under this Contract without the prior written consent of the State; provided, however, that Contractor shall be allowed to use non-confidential materials for writing samples in pursuit of the work. The ownership rights described herein shall include, but not be limited to, the right to copy, publish, display, transfer, prepare derivative works, or otherwise use the works.

24. PUBLIC DISCLOSURE / NEWS RELEASES: No public disclosures or news releases pertaining to this solicitation shall be made without prior written approval of TPWD.

25. CONFIDENTIALITY AND SECURITY: The Contractor should not receive any sensitive or confidential information under the Contract. Any information the Contractor compiles or creates as a result of the Contract must be maintained and protected in accordance with any federal, state, or local laws and regulations that apply. The Contractor shall establish a method to secure the confidentiality of records and other information relating to clients in accordance with applicable federal and state laws, rules, and regulations. The obligations of the Contractor under this Confidentiality and Security Article shall survive this Contract and shall be included in all subcontracts.

26. TERMINATION: This Contract shall terminate upon full performance of all requirements contained in this Contract, unless otherwise extended or renewed as provided in accordance with the Contract Terms and Conditions.

- 26.1. Termination for Convenience: TPWD reserves the right to terminate the Contract at any time, in whole or in part, without cost or penalty, by providing 30 calendar days' advance written notice if TPWD determines that such termination is in the best interest of the state. In the event of such a termination, the Contractor shall, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon in writing, cease all work immediately upon the effective date of termination. TPWD will be liable for payments limited only to the portion of work authorized by TPWD in writing and completed prior to the effective date of cancellation, provided that TPWD shall not be liable for any work performed that is not acceptable to TPWD and/or does not meet Contract requirements. All work products produced by the Contractor and paid for by TPWD shall become the property of TPWD and shall be tendered upon request. Termination under this paragraph shall not relieve the Vendor of any obligation or liability that has occurred prior to cancellation.
- 26.2. Termination for Cause/Default: If the Contractor fails to provide the goods or services contracted for according to the provisions of the Contract or fails to comply with any of the terms or conditions of the Contract, the TPWD may, upon written notice of default to the Contractor, terminate all or any part of the Contract after providing an opportunity to cure the default.

- 26.2.1. Contractor will be responsible for paying damages to TPWD including but not limited to re-procurement costs, and any consequential damages to the State of Texas or TPWD resulting from Contractor's non-performance. The defaulting Contractor will not be considered in the re-solicitation and may not be considered in future solicitations for the same type of work unless the specification or scope of work is significantly changed.
- 26.3. The rights and remedies of TPWD provided in this clause shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this Contract.
- 26.4. TPWD may exercise any other right, remedy or privilege which may be available to it under applicable law of the state and any other applicable law or may proceed by appropriate court action to enforce the provisions of the Contract, or to recover damages for the breach of any agreement being derived from the Contract. The exercise of any of the foregoing remedies will not constitute a termination of the Contract unless TPWD notifies the Contractor in writing prior to the exercise of such remedy. The Contractor shall remain liable for all covenants and indemnities under the Contract. The Contractor shall be liable for all costs and expenses, including court costs, incurred by TPWD with respect to the enforcement of any of the remedies listed herein.
27. **SURVIVAL OF TERMS:** Termination of the Contract for any reason shall not release the Contractor from any liability or obligation set forth in the Contract that is expressly stated to survive any such termination or by its nature would be intended to be applicable following any such termination, including the provisions regarding confidentiality, indemnification, transition, records, audit, property rights, dispute resolution, and invoice and fees verification.
28. **RIGHTS UPON TERMINATION OR EXPIRATION OF CONTRACT:** In the event that the Contract is terminated for any reason, or upon its expiration, TPWD shall retain ownership of all associated work products and documentation obtained from the Contractor under the Contract, unless otherwise specified.
29. **CHANGE IN FEDERAL OR STATE REQUIREMENTS:** If federal or state laws or regulations or other federal or state requirements are amended or judicially interpreted so that either TPWD or the Contractor cannot reasonably fulfill the Contract and if the Parties cannot agree to an amendment that would enable substantial continuation of the Contract, the Parties shall be discharged from any further obligations under the Contract.
30. **TAXES:** Purchases made for state uses are exempt from Texas State Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax. An Excise Tax Exemption Certificate will be furnished upon written request to TPWD.
31. **BUY TEXAS:** In accordance with §2155.4441, Gov't Code, the Contractor agrees that during the performance of a Contract for services it shall purchase products and materials produced in Texas when they are available at a price and time comparable to products and materials produced outside Texas.
32. **NOTE TO RESPONDENT:** Any terms and conditions attached to a solicitation will not be considered unless specifically referred to on this solicitation form and may result in disqualification of the response submission. If any Respondent takes a 'blanket exception' to the entire solicitation or does not provide proposed alternative language, the Respondent's response may be disqualified from further consideration.
33. **ACCESSIBILITY STANDARDS:** Under Texas Government Code, Chapter 2054, Subchapter M, TPWD must procure products that comply with the Accessibility Standards defined in the Texas Administrative Code, 1 TAC 206 and 1 TAC 213, when such products are available in the commercial marketplace or when such products are developed in response to a procurement solicitation. Accordingly, Contractor must provide electronic and information resources and associated product documentation and technical support that comply with these Accessibility Standards (in the form of a Voluntary Product Accessibility Template, or "VPAT") in its response to this solicitation. Vendors who do not already have accessibility documentation should complete the form located here: <http://www.itic.org/policy/accessibility/>. Contractors that claim their

products are exempt from accessibility requirements must present that position to TPWD as a question during the question-and-answer period of the solicitation.

34. **CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, INELIGIBILITY, AND VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION:** Respondent certifies that the responding entity and its principals are eligible to participate in this transaction and have not been subjected to suspension, debarment, or similar ineligibility determined by any federal, state or local governmental entity and the Respondent is in compliance with the State of Texas statutes and rules relating to procurement and that Respondent is not listed on the federal government's terrorism watch list as described in Executive Order 13224.
35. **SYSTEM FOR AWARD MANAGEMENT (SAM):** Respondent certifies that it and its principals are not suspended or debarred from doing business with the state or federal government as listed on the State of Texas Debarred Vendor List maintained by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts and the System for Award Management (SAM) maintained by the General Services Administration. Prior to awarding state funds for goods and/or services rendered, the State of Texas will conduct a required search of your firm using SAM. This is a Federal government-maintained database that records and tracks organizations, either known to or suspected of contributing to terrorist organizations. No state funds may be paid to an individual or firm whose name appears on this list. TPWD reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to deny and/or exclude any individual or firm from an award whose name appears on this list.
36. **FEDERAL DISASTER RELIEF FRAUD:** Sections and 2261.053 of the Gov't Code, prohibit state agencies from accepting a response or awarding a Contract that includes proposed financial participation by a person who, in the past five years has been convicted of violating a federal law or assessed a penalty in connection with a Contract involving relief for Hurricane Rita, Hurricane Katrina, or any other disaster, as defined by Section 418.004 of the Gov't Code, occurring after September 24, 2005. Under Sections 2155.006 and 2261.053 of the Texas Gov't Code, Respondent certifies that the individual or business entity named in this response or Contract is not ineligible to receive the specified Contract and acknowledges that this Contract may be terminated and payment withheld if this certification is inaccurate.
37. **APPLICABLE LAWS AND VENUE:** The Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, with regards to the conflicts of law provisions. The venue of any suit arising under this Contract is fixed in any court of competent jurisdiction in Travis County, Texas, unless the specific venue is otherwise identified in a statute which directly names or otherwise identifies its applicability to TPWD.
38. **APPLICABLE LAWS AND CONFORMING AMENDMENTS:** Contractor must comply with all laws, regulations, requirements and guidelines applicable to a Contractor providing services to the State of Texas as these laws, regulations, requirements and guidelines currently exist and as they are amended throughout the term of this Contract. TPWD reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to unilaterally amend this Contract throughout its term to incorporate any modifications necessary for TPWD or Contractor's compliance with all applicable State and federal laws, and regulations.
39. **COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS; DEALING WITH PUBLIC SERVANTS:**
- 39.1. The Respondent must comply with all applicable laws at all times, including, without limitation, the following: (i) Texas Penal Code §36.02, which prohibits bribery; (ii) Texas Penal Code §36.09, which prohibits the offering or conferring of benefits to public servants; (iii) Gov't Code §2155.003, which prohibits the chief clerk or any other employee of the TPWD from having an interest in, or in any manner be connected with, a Contract or bid for a purchase of goods or services by an agency of the state or accept from any person to whom a Contract has been awarded anything of value or a promise, obligation, or Contract for future reward or compensation.
- 39.2. The Respondent shall give all notices and comply with all laws and regulations applicable to furnishing and performance of the Contract. Except where otherwise expressly required by applicable laws and regulations, TPWD shall not be responsible for monitoring Respondent's

compliance with any laws or regulations. If Respondent performs any work knowing or having reason to know that it is contrary to laws or regulations, Respondent shall bear all claims, costs, losses and damages caused by, arising out of or resulting therefrom.

40. **NO WAIVER:** Nothing in this Contract shall be construed as a waiver of the state's or TPWD's sovereign immunity. This Contract shall not constitute or be construed as a waiver of any of the privileges, rights, defenses, remedies, or immunities available to the State of Texas. The failure to enforce, or any delay in the enforcement, of any privileges, rights, defenses, remedies, or immunities available to the State of Texas. The failure to enforce, or any delay in the enforcement, of any privileges, rights, defenses, remedies, or immunities available to the State of Texas under this Contract or under applicable law shall not constitute a waiver of such privileges, rights, defenses, remedies, or immunities or be considered as a basis for estoppel. TPWD does not waive any privileges, rights, defenses, or immunities available to TPWD by entering into this Contract or by the conduct of any representative of TPWD, prior to or subsequent to entering into this Contract.
41. **NO LIABILITY UPON TERMINATION:** If this Contract is terminated for any reason, TPWD and the State of Texas shall not be liable to Contractor for any damages, claims, losses, or any other amounts arising from or related to any such termination. However, Contractor may be entitled to the remedies provided in Gov't Code, Chapter 2260.
42. **DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES; UNFAIR BUSINESS PRACTICES:** Respondent represents and warrants that it has not been the subject of allegations of Deceptive Trade Practices violations under Tex. Bus. & Com. Code, Chapter 17, or allegations of any unfair business practice in any administrative hearing or court suit and that Respondent has not been found to be liable for such practices in such proceedings. Contractor certifies that it has no officers who have served as officers of other entities who have been the subject of Deceptive Trade Practice violations or allegations of any unfair business practices in an administrative hearing or court suit, and that such officers have not been found to be liable for such practices in such proceedings.
43. **FALSE STATEMENTS; BREACH OF REPRESENTATIONS:** If Respondent signed its Bid/Proposal with a false statement or signs the Contract with a false statement or it is subsequently determined that Contractor has violated any of the representations, warranties, guarantees, certifications or affirmations included in the Contract, Contractor shall be in default under this Contract and TPWD may terminate or void the Contract for cause and pursue other remedies available to TPWD under this Contract and applicable law.
44. **ACTUAL AND PERCEIVED CONFLICTS:** By submitting a Bid/Proposal, the Respondent represents and warrants that the provision of goods and services or other performance under the Contract will not constitute an actual or potential conflict of interest or reasonably create an appearance of impropriety. In its Bid/Proposal, the Respondent shall disclose any existing or potential conflict of interest that it might have in contracting with TPWD. The TPWD will decide, in its sole discretion, whether an actual or perceived conflict should result in Bid/Proposal disqualification or Contract termination.
45. **CURRENT AND FORMER TPWD EMPLOYEES:**
- 45.1. In addition to the disclosures required above, the Respondent shall also disclose any of its personnel who are current or former officers or employees of the TPWD or who are related, within the third degree by consanguinity (as defined by Gov't Code §573.023) or within the second degree by affinity (as defined by Gov't Code §573.025), to any current or former officers or employees of the TPWD.
- 45.2. Respondents must comply with all applicable Texas and federal laws and regulations relating to the hiring of former state employees (see e.g., Gov't Code Chapters 572 and 573). Such "revolving door" provisions generally restrict former agency heads from communicating with or appearing before the agency on certain matters for two years after leaving the agency. The revolving door

provisions also restrict some former employees from representing clients on matters that the employee participated in during state service or matters that were in the employees' official responsibility or from working for certain entities after their state employment. Respondent, by signing this solicitation, certifies that it has complied with all applicable laws and regulations regarding former state employees.

46. INSURANCE AND OTHER SECURITY:

- 46.1. Respondent represents and warrants that it will, within ten (10) business days of executing this agreement, provide TPWD with current certificates of insurance or other proof acceptable to TPWD of the required insurance coverage.
- 46.2. The Respondent represents and warrants that it will obtain and maintain for the term of the Contract all insurance coverage required under this solicitation. Contractor's failure to obtain or maintain the specified coverage during the term of the agreement will be considered a breach of the Contract.
- 46.3. The Respondent represents and warrants that all of the above coverage will be obtained from companies that are licensed in the state of Texas, have an "A" rating from Best, and are authorized to provide the coverage. The Respondent shall furnish proof of insurance upon request of TPWD.

47. SEVERABILITY: If any provision of the Contract is construed to be illegal or invalid, such construction will not affect the legality or validity of any of its other provisions. The illegal or invalid provision will be deemed severable and stricken from the Contract as if it had never been incorporated herein, but all other provisions will continue in full force and effect.

48. HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES (HUB): Respondent represents and warrants that it shall comply with the Historically Underutilized Business requirements pursuant to Gov't Code, Chapter 2161.

49. AMENDMENTS: Except as provided in *Section III, Paragraph 8* of this Contract, this Contract may be amended only upon written agreement between TPWD and Contractor; however, any Amendment of this Contract that conflicts with the laws of the State of Texas shall be void. The Contractor shall not be entitled to payment for any additional services, work, or products that are not authorized by a properly executed Contract amendment.

50. CHANGE MANAGEMENT: The Respondent agrees that the key personnel assigned to the Contract shall remain available for the entirety of the project throughout the term of the Contract as long as that individual is employed by the Respondent or unless TPWD agrees to a change in the key personnel.

51. FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL REQUIREMENTS: Respondent shall demonstrate on-site compliance with the Federal Tax Reform Act of 1986, Section 1706, amending Section 530 of the Revenue Act of 1978, dealing with issuance of Form W-2's to common law employees. Respondent is responsible for both federal and State unemployment insurance coverage and standard Worker's Compensation insurance coverage. Respondent shall comply with all federal and State tax laws and withholding requirements. The State of Texas shall not be liable to Respondent or its employees for any Unemployment or Workers' Compensation coverage, or federal or State withholding requirements. **Contractor shall indemnify the State of Texas and shall pay all costs, penalties, or losses resulting from its omission or breach of this Section.**

52. INDEMNIFICATION AND LIABILITY:

- 52.1 **Acts or Omissions: CONTRACTOR SHALL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE STATE OF TEXAS, TPWD, AND/OR THEIR OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, REPRESENTATIVES, CONTRACTORS, ASSIGNEES, AND/OR DESIGNEES FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY, ACTIONS, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, OR SUITS, AND ALL RELATED COSTS, ATTORNEY FEES, AND EXPENSES ARISING OUT OF, OR RESULTING FROM ANY ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF THE CONTRACTOR OR ITS AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, SUBCONTRACTORS, ORDER**

FULLFILLERS, OR SUPPLIERS OF SUBCONTRACTORS IN THE EXECUTION OR PERFORMANCE OF THE CONTRACT AND ANY PURCHASE ORDERS ISSUED UNDER THE CONTRACT. THE DEFENSE SHALL BE COORDINATED BY CONTRACTOR WITH THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL WHEN TEXAS STATE AGENCIES ARE NAMED DEFENDANTS IN ANY LAWSUIT AND CONTRACTOR MAY NOT AGREE TO ANY SETTLEMENT WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING THE CONCURRENCE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL. CONTRACTOR AND TPWD AGREE TO FURNISH TIMELY WRITTEN NOTICE TO EACH OTHER OF ANY SUCH CLAIM.

52.2 Infringements:

52.2.1 CONTRACTOR SHALL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE STATE OF TEXAS, TPWD, AND/OR THEIR EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, REPRESENTATIVES, CONTRACTORS, ASSIGNEES, AND/OR DESIGNEES FROM ANY AND ALL THIRD-PARTY CLAIMS INVOLVING INFRINGEMENT OF UNITED STATES PATENTS, COPYRIGHTS, TRADE AND SERVICE MARKS, AND ANY OTHER INTELLECTUAL OR INTANGIBLE PROPERTY RIGHTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE PERFORMANCES OR ACTIONS OF CONTRACTOR PURSUANT TO THIS CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR AND TPWD AGREE TO FURNISH TIMELY WRITTEN NOTICE TO EACH OTHER OF ANY SUCH CLAIM. CONTRACTOR SHALL BE LIABLE TO PAY ALL COSTS OF DEFENSE INCLUDING ATTORNEYS' FEES. THE DEFENSE SHALL BE COORDINATED BY CONTRACTOR WITH THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL WHEN TEXAS STATE AGENCIES ARE NAMED DEFENDANTS IN ANY LAWSUIT AND CONTRACTOR MAY NOT AGREE TO ANY SETTLEMENT WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING THE CONCURRENCE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

52.2.2 Contractor shall have no liability under this Section if the alleged infringement is caused in whole or in part by: (i) use of the product or service for a purpose or in a manner for which the product or service was not designed, (ii) any modification made to the product without Contractor's written approval, (iii) any modifications made to the product by the Contractor pursuant to Customer's specific instructions, (iv) any intellectual property right owned by or licensed to Customer, or (v) any use of the product or service by Customer that is not in conformity with the terms of any applicable license agreement.

52.2.3 If Contractor becomes aware of an actual or potential claim, or Customer provides Contractor with notice of an actual or potential claim, Contractor may (or in the case of an injunction against Customer, shall), at Contractor's sole option and expense; (i) procure for the Customer the right to continue to use the affected portion of the product or service, or (ii) modify or replace the affected portion of the product or service with functionally equivalent or superior product or service so that Customer's use is non-infringing.

52.3 Compensation/Unemployment Insurance – Including Indemnity:

52.3.1 CONTRACTOR AGREES AND ACKNOWLEDGES THAT DURING THE EXISTENCE OF THIS CONTRACT, CONTRACTOR SHALL BE ENTIRELY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE LIABILITY AND PAYMENT OF CONTRACTOR'S AND CONTRACTOR'S EMPLOYEES' TAXES OF WHATEVER KIND, ARISING OUT OF THE PERFORMANCES IN THIS CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR AGREES TO COMPLY WITH ALL STATE AND FEDERAL LAWS APPLICABLE TO ANY SUCH PERSONS, INCLUDING LAWS REGARDING WAGES, TAXES, INSURANCE, AND WORKERS' COMPENSATION. TPWD AND/OR THE STATE SHALL NOT BE LIABLE TO THE CONTRACTOR, ITS EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, OR OTHERS FOR THE PAYMENT OF TAXES OR THE PROVISION OF UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE AND/ OR WORKERS' COMPENSATION OR ANY BENEFIT AVAILABLE TO A STATE EMPLOYEE OR EMPLOYEE OF ANOTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY CUSTOMER.

52.3.2 **CONTRACTOR AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS TPWD, THE STATE OF TEXAS AND/OR THEIR EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, REPRESENTATIVES, CONTRACTORS, AND/OR ASSIGNEES FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY, ACTIONS, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, OR SUITS, AND ALL RELATED COSTS, ATTORNEYS' FEES, AND EXPENSES, RELATING TO TAX LIABILITY, UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE AND/OR WORKERS' COMPENSATION UNDER THIS CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR SHALL BE LIABLE TO PAY ALL COSTS OF DEFENSE INCLUDING ATTORNEYS' FEES. THE DEFENSE SHALL BE COORDINATED BY VENDOR WITH THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL WHEN TEXAS STATE AGENCIES ARE NAMED DEFENDANTS IN ANY LAWSUIT AND CONTRACTOR MAY NOT AGREE TO ANY SETTLEMENT WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING THE CONCURRENCE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL. CONTRACTOR AND TPWD AGREE TO FURNISH TIMELY WRITTEN NOTICE TO EACH OTHER OF ANY SUCH CLAIM.**

53. **CONTRACTOR LIABILITY FOR DAMAGE TO GOVERNMENT PROPERTY:** The Contractor shall be liable for all damages to government-owned, leased, or occupied property and equipment caused by the Contractor and its employees, agents, subcontractors, and suppliers, including any delivery or cartage company, in connection with any performance pursuant to the Contract. The Contractor shall notify the TPWD Contract Manager in writing of any such damage within one (1) calendar day.
54. **FELONY CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS:** Respondent represents and warrants that Contractor has not and Respondent's employees have not been convicted of a felony criminal offense, or that, if such a conviction has occurred, Respondent has fully advised TPWD as to the facts and circumstances surrounding the conviction.
55. **IMMIGRATION:** The Respondent represents and warrants that it shall comply with the requirements of the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 and 1990 regarding employment verification and retention of verification forms for any individuals hired on or after November 6, 1986, who will perform any labor or services under the Contract. The Respondent also represents and warrants that it shall comply with the requirements of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 ("IIRIRA).
56. **SUBCONTRACTORS:** Subcontractors providing service under the Contract shall meet the same requirements and level of experience as required of the Contractor. No subcontract under the Purchase Order shall relieve the primary Contractor of responsibility for the service. If the Contractor uses a subcontractor for any or all of the work required, the following conditions shall apply under the listed circumstances:
- 56.1. Respondents planning to subcontract all, or a portion of the work shall identify the proposed subcontractors.
 - 56.2. Subcontracting shall be at the Contractor's expense.
 - 56.3. TPWD retains the right to check subcontractor's background and make determination to approve or reject the use of submitted subcontractors.
 - 56.4. The Contractor shall be the only Contact for TPWD and subcontractors. Respondent shall list a designated point of contact for all TPWD and subcontractor inquiries.
 - 56.5. The Contractor, in subcontracting for any performances specified herein, expressly understands and acknowledges that in entering into such subcontract(s), TPWD is in no manner liable to any subcontractor(s) of the Contractor. In no event shall this provision relieve the Contractor of the responsibility for ensuring that the performances rendered under all subcontracts are rendered so as to comply with all terms of this solicitation and Contract. The Contractor shall manage all quality and performance, project management, and schedules for subcontractors. The Contractor shall be held solely responsible and accountable for the completion of all work for which the Contractor has subcontracted.

57. **PROTEST PROCEDURES:** Any actual or prospective Respondent who is aggrieved in connection with this solicitation, evaluation, or award of any Contract resulting from this solicitation may formally protest as provided in TPWD's rules at TAC, Title 31, Part 2, Chapter 51, Subchapter L, Rule 51.350.
58. **NON-APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS:** Any Contract resulting from this solicitation is subject to termination or cancellation, without penalty to TPWD, either in whole or in part, subject to the availability of state funds. TPWD is a state agency whose authority and appropriations are subject to actions of the Texas Legislature. If TPWD becomes subject to a legislative change, revocation of statutory authority, or lack of appropriated funds which would render TPWD's or Contractor's delivery or performance under the Contract impossible or unnecessary, the Contract will be terminated or cancelled and be deemed null and void. In the event of a termination or cancellation under this Section, TPWD will not be liable to Contractor for any damages, which are caused or associated with such termination, or cancellation and TPWD will not be required to give prior notice.
59. **NON-DISCRIMINATION/CIVIL RIGHTS:** The Respondent agrees that no person shall, on the ground of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, political affiliation, or religious belief, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, be subjected to discrimination under, or be denied employment in the administration of, or in connection with, any program or activity funded in whole or in part with funds available under this Contract. The Respondent shall comply with Executive Order 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Executive Order 11375, "Amending Executive Order 11246 relating to Equal Employment Opportunity," and as supplemented by regulations at 41 C.F.R. Part 60. The prime Contractor shall ensure that this clause is included in all subcontracts.
