San Antonio Highlights

Globally, 445 cities from 47 countries participated in the 2022 City Nature Challenge. San Antonio ranked #18 for Observations, #13 for Species, and #17 for Observers globally, placing it in the top 4% of projects.

Cumulative Impact

66% of the observations recorded during the City Nature Challenge in the San Antonio area were **Research Grade** - observations of wild organisms with photo or sound vouchers of a quality to merit a species-level identification by the majority of identifiers.
