## By the numbers:

- 6 counties
- More than 3,215 observations
- 1,150 species recorded
- 126 observers
- More than 345 identifiers
- 98% of observations were verifiable

## Brazos Valley Highlights

Globally, 482 cities from 46 countries participated in the 2023 City Nature Challenge. Brazos Valley ranked **#130 for Observations**, **#82 for Species**, and **#134 for Observers** globally, placing it in the top 26% of projects.

## Cumulative Impact

64% of the observations recorded during the City Nature Challenge in the Brazos Valley project area were **Research Grade** - observations of wild organisms with photo or sound vouchers of a quality to merit a species-level identification by the majority of identifiers.

64% of all Observations to Research Grade

During the 4 days of the event, the project saw:

- 30 Species of Greatest Conservation Need at Research Grade (see list)
- 64 new species records in iNaturalist
- 1.4% increase in iNaturalist observations for the project counties
