Houston-Galveston Highlights

Globally, 482 cities from 46 countries participated in the 2023 City Nature Challenge. Houston-Galveston ranked #5 for Observations, #5 for Species, and #6 for Observers globally, placing it in the top 1% of projects globally.

Cumulative Impact

48% of the observations recorded during the City Nature Challenge in the Houston-Galveston area were **Research Grade** - observations of wild organisms with photo or sound vouchers of a quality to merit a species-level identification by the majority of identifiers.

48% of all **Observations** to Research Grade

During the 4 days of the event, the project saw:

- 59 Species of Greatest Conservation Need at Research Grade (see list)
- 152 new species records in iNaturalist
- 4% increase in iNaturalist observations for the project counties
