Award Winners Honored in April 2016

Many instructors were honored during the 2016 conference held in Houston.



2015 VOLUNTEER INSTRUCTOR of the YEAR José Garcia, Irving

VOLUNTEER INSTRUCTOR of the YEAR

An instructor since 1993, Garcia earned his Texas Hunter Education *Hall of Fame* Award in 2009 and is credited with over 2,150 students. He is an active "huntmaster" for the Texas Youth Hunting Program (*TYHP.ORG*) conducting youth hunts for over 20 years. He has participated in many outreach events including the Dallas Safari Club's "SAFETY" event held semiannually for 250 youth participating in all shooting disciplines, hunter skills and wildlife activities. GAME WARDEN of the Year Jerry Gordon, TPWD GW Academy

The former Captain at TPWD's Law Enforcement Cadet Training Center near Star, Gordon and his wife raised their daughters as young natural resource leaders and have coordinated an annual 4-H Hunter Education Camp at the Academy each year. Gordon also assisted Hunter Education staff in certifying game warden cadets and was active in hunter education workshops, training hunter education students, conducting volunteer instructor interviews and background checks, as well as presenting at the International Hunter Education Association-USA conferences in 2013 and 2014. PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR of the Year – Cecario "CG" Guerrero, Houston

Guerrero served over 30 years as an inner city agriculture science teacher and Texas Youth Hunting Program Regional Coordinator, Guerrero was credited with teaching over 1,000 students. He also is a top TYHP "Huntmaster" having personally led over 50 youth hunts and taken hundreds of youth on their first hunting trips - several to Colorado on Western Big Game hunts. 2015 REGIONAL INSTRUCTORS of the Year



Ruben Rangel, Brownsville - S Texas

Among Rangel's many accomplishments are his coordination of youth mentor hunts (waterfowl hunt for 25 youth/dove hunt for over 200 youth), assistance at HE Instructor Workshops, and his activity leading Rio Grande Valley efforts with his mobile Hunter Education trailer. He's considered the Pied Piper of the Valley! (*Presenter: Brock Minton – S TX HE Specialist*)



Joe Drobniak, Friendswood – SE Texas Drobniak earned the Texas Hall of Fame award in 2009 and is credited with teaching over 1,750 students. He developed curricula and gave it to the HE Program along with other teaching tips/tech. (Presenter: Heidi Rao – SE TX HE Specialist)



Charles Preslar, Garland – N Texas

Presler has since entered the Texas Hunter Education Hall of Fame in 2017 (see page 8), but was the 2015 Regional Instructor of the Year for North Texas. He has certified over 1,300 students and is active at many North Texas outreach events, including an annual event held at the TPWD's Law Enforcement Academy and Dallas Safari's SAFETY event. He also serves as president of the Texas State Rifle Association Foundation, a partner of youth shooting sports and hunter education programs. (Presenter: Monica Bickerstaff – N TX HE Specialist)



Hartmut Mueller, El Paso - W Texas Mueller (second from right) has taught over 1,000 students since 1989 and is a longtime trainer in Far West Texas. The award was presented at the TPWD Law Enforcement Office in El Paso (Presenter: Randy Spradlin – W TX HE Specialist; TPWD Game Wardens)



Garland Walker, Kyle – Central Texas

Walker has since entered the Texas Hunter Education *Hall of Fame* in 2017 and has certified over 1850 students. The award was presented at Cabela's in Buda where Walker taught most of his courses. Walker has now moved to NE Texas and plans to continue teaching many courses, but with less students in rural East Texas. *(Presenter: Steve Hall – TX HE Coordinator)*

Jeannette Hammonds, Fort Worth A 2015 Hall of Fame recipient, Hammonds, from Ft. Worth, accepted her award along with a bouquet of flowers at the 2016 Conference. She has taught over 3,400 students alongside her *Hall of Fame* husband, David. The Hammonds have served as longtime coordinators of the North Texas "Youth Hunter Education Challenge" and were integral in sending a team to the National NRA YHEC in the summer, 2017. Gilbert has taught over 4,000 students and volunteers at many workshops and events. 2016 GAME WARDEN of the Year Darla Barr, Whitesboro

2016 PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR of the Year – Robin Wheelus, *Devine*

An Agriculture Science Teacher, Wheelus accepted his award during a Future Farmers of America event. He has taught hunter education since 2000, and boater and bow hunter education at Devine High School. He takes students on many field trips & activities such as Youth Shooting Sports Events at the Chaparral WMA; Trapping Workshops; National Archery in Schools regional & state tournaments; 4-H shooting sports events; & many other outdoor/conservation events. He represents over 800+ Ag. Science educators teaching at the high school level. TPWD attends the Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association of Texas every summer to certify educators in the TPWD Hunter Education program. (Presenter: Brock Minton – S TX HE Specialist)



2016 REGIONAL INSTRUCTORS of the Year



Benjamin "Benny" Ham, Whitsett – S TX

Ham accepted his award at the 2017 conference. He has assisted with numerous workshops, hunts, summer youth camps, Hunting 101s, the Lonesome Dove Fest, and a youth shooting sports event at the Chaparral WMA. He has trained over 600 students in the rural area, and will travel throughout Texas to assist HE Staff with training. (Presenter: Brock Minton – S TX HE Specialist)



Casimer Stawicki, Houston – SE Texas

Southeast TX Instructor of the Year (photo p. 5) Casimer or "Casey" as he is better known, an Area Chief Hunter Education Instructor from Houston, typically dreams up big ideas for the program. He is always available to SE TX Hunter Ed staff any time he is needed to teach student and instructor courses, Ethics Workshops (statewide), or outreach events such as the Houston Rodeo. 
Melanie Sturgis, Dallas – N Texas

Sturgis, who is also part of the **Texas Training Crew**, who received the TEAM of the YEAR Award (see page 7), but gets credit for 500 of the thousands of students taught by the Training Crew. She is active at teaching summer camps including scouts and the Outdoor Texas summer camp program. She is involved in shoots, DIVAS and outdoor women instructional programs among her many outreach events and accomplishments. Like Stawicki in SE TX, she is always available to N TX staff such as helping with Ag Science Instructor training at Tarleton State University in 2017. Rodney Sturdivant (1955-2017)

Rodney Sturdivant, Coleman, was presented the regional award, posthumously. His widow and fellow instructor, Melissa Sturdivant, received the award bravely and humbly on Rodney's behalf. During the conference, there was a nice TPWDproduced photo montage and video produced by the Waterfowl Brigades - a tribute to honor Sturdivant for his many years of accomplishments.



Rodney's passing was a blow to the TX Hunter Education Program. He passed just a month prior to the awards ceremony. Grace Pratt, Pflugerville – Central TX

Area Chief Hunter Education Instructor, Grace Pratt, has taught new instructors, Hunting 101 and 476 students at Austin Commerce Park (TPWD Offices) and in her home town of Pflugerville. She has contributed greatly to the Outdoor Woman program teaching Introduction to firearms, rifle/handgun and Hunter Education.
