- 1a. Distance from the front of eye to the tip of lips (A) is greater than the distance from under eye to bottom of fish head (B) go to 2
- 1b. Distance from just before eye to tip of lips (A) is less than distance from under eye to bottom of fish head (B) go to 7



- 2a. Fish has a pointed bill-like snout go to 6
- 2b. Fish does not have a pointed bill-like snout go to 3
- 3a. Fish has a forked tail fin go to 4
- 3b. Fish does not have a forked tail fin go to 5
- 4a. Fish does not have an operculum Bull Shark
- 4b. Fish has an operculum **Spanish Mackerel**
- 5a. Fish has a protruding lower jaw American Eel
- 5b. Fish does not have a protruding lower jaw Alligator Gar
- 6a. Fish has forked adipose fin Sailfish
- 6b. Fish does not have forked adipose fin Paddlefish
- 7a. Fish has both eyes on one side of the body **Flounder**
- 7b. Fish has one eye on each side of the body go to 8
- 8a. Fish has a long, single dorsal fin extending the length of the back go to 9
- 8b. Fish does not have a long, single dorsal fin extending the length of the back go to 12
- 9a. Fish has black spot near tail fin go to 10
- 9b. Fish does not have a distinct black spot near tail fin go to 11
- 10a. Fish has a rounded tail fin **Bowfin**
- 10. Fish has does not have a rounded tail fin go to 12
- 11a. Fish's fins have a yellow outline Green Sunfish
- 11b. Fish's fins do not have a yellow outline go to 12
- 12b. Fish has a rounded tail fin Pecos Gambusia
- 12c. Fish does not have a rounded tail fin go to 13
- 13a. Fish has single dorsal fin, extending the length of the body, comes to a point Blue Tilapia
- 13b. Fish does not have a single dorsal fin, extending the length of the body, that comes to a point go to 14
- 14a. Fish has at least one horizontal stripe on the body (not including lateral line or head) go to 15
- 14b. Fish does not have horizontal stripes on the body go to 16



- 15a. Fish has multiple horizontal stripes on the body Striped Bass
- 15c. Fish has one horizontal stripe on the body Largemouth Bass
- 16a. Fish has a black and white vertical striped pattern Sheepshead
- 16b. Fish does not have a black and white vertical striped pattern go to 17
- 17a. Fish has vertical bars on the body Guadalupe Bass
- 17b. Fish does not have vertical bars on the body go to 18
- 18a. Fish has a single dark spot on the side of the body go to 21
- 18b. Fish has multiple spots or no spots on the side of the body go to 19
- 19a. Fish has multiple spots or speckles on the side of the body go to 20
- 19b. Fish does not have spots on the side of the body go to 24
- 20a. Fish has black spots on the back half of the body Spotted Seatrout
- 20b. Fish has black spots throughout the entire body go to 23
- 21a. Fish has a single dark spot near head Gizzard Shad
- 21b. Fish has a single dark spot near tail go to 22
- 22a. Fish has a single, triangular dorsal fin **Blacktail Shiner**
- 22b. Fish does not have single, triangular dorsal fin Red Drum (Redfish)
- 23a. Fish has a colorful iridescent body Rainbow Trout
- 23b. Fish does not have a colorful iridescent body go to 27
- 24a. Fish has a large mouth with protruding lower jaw go to 25
- 24b. Fish does not have a large mouth with protruding lower jaw go to 26
- 25a. Fish has a forked caudal fin **Tarpon**
- 25b. Fish does not have a forked caudal fin American Eel
- 26a. Fish is bright red color **Red Snapper**
- 26b. Fish is not a bright red color go to 28
- 27. Fish has barbels on top, side, and below the mouth Channel Catfish
- 28a. Fish pectoral fins are larger than pelvic fins **Bull Shark**
- 28b. Fish does not have pectoral fins are larger than pelvic fins Common Carp
