

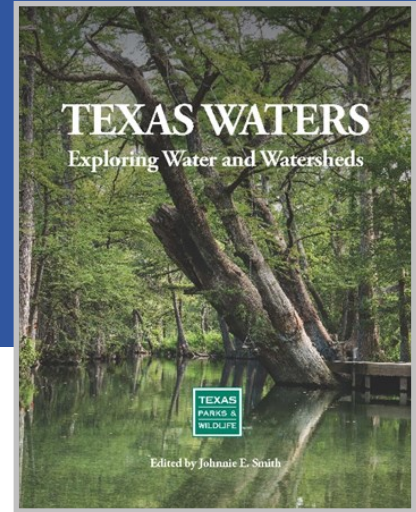

Certification Requirements

Obtain at least 8 hours of Advanced Training from a combination of the following:

- Attend Texas Waters webinars - live webinars and/or view recorded webinars
- Read Texas Waters curriculum and answer Questions to Consider and/or pass quizzes
- Attend Texas Waters Day event, sessions, or field trips at the Master Naturalist Annual Meeting
- Other approved aquatic or watershed learning activities or trainings (*up to 4 hours*)

New Specialists earn a Certificate of Recognition and a heron pin!

Annual Renewal Requirements

- Participate in at least 10 hours of volunteer service in the area of aquatic conservation, ecology, education, or stewardship
- Examples: Habitat restoration, water quality monitoring, clean-ups, and educational events
