OSR Voluntary On This Unit

Archery Only White-tailed Deer Season: Oct. 1-Jan. 1 Bag limit - 3 deer (either sex, no more than 1 buck). Legal buck must have at least one unbranched antler or an inside spread of at least 13 inches.

Feral Hogs: (no bag limit)

Archery Only Season: No closed season. See "Special Regulations".

General Season: Jan. 2-May 31. Shotguns (with slugs or buckshot) and archery.

Dove: Sept. 1-Oct 31.

Waterfowl: Shooting hours - one half hour before sunrise to noon. Hunting is allowed each day of the **Early Teal, North Zone Duck** and **Eastern Zone Goose** seasons.

Snipe and Woodcock: May be taken during the open seasons for these species during waterfowl hunt dates.

Squirrel, Rabbits & Hares, & Raccoons: Oct. 1-Feb. 26 and May 1-31.

Fishing: No permit required.

Bullfrogs: (No firearms) Daily limit of 25.

Means Restrictions: Firearms are restricted to shotguns with non-toxic shot or no larger than #4 lead shot except for general season feral hog.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS: No shooting within 50 yards of power substation on Caddo Creek Unit. Hunting animals at night is prohibited except while pursuing bullfrogs and raccoons during specified seasons. The use of dogs for hunting feral hogs and white-tailed deer is prohibited. Use of horses is allowed Sept. 1-31 and Jun. 1-Aug. 31. No target shooting. No OHV use on area. See Prohibited Acts for further restrictions.

Parking is restricted to designated areas, do not block gates or roads.

Waterfowl Hunting Only Area: Hunting is restricted to the surface of Lake Tawakoni within the existing water's edge. Waterfowl are the only legal species that may be hunted. Waterfowl hunting is prohibited within 300 yards of an inhabitable structure and within 100 yards of park boundaries, the dam, spillway, and SRA office area.

MANDATORY DEER CHECK STATION: Hunters who harvest white-tailed deer within Duck Cove or Caddo Creek Units are **REQUIRED** to bring their animals to a TPWD check station within 48 hours of harvest. Hunters must check each animal harvested and receive a CWD receipt before taking any part of that animal from the CWD Zone, including any meat or quartered parts.
