

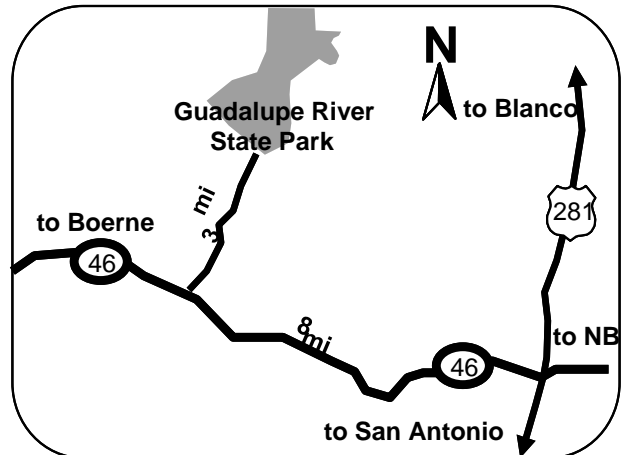


# GUADALUPE RIVER STATE PARK BAUER UNIT

## BACKGROUND

Guadalupe River State Park consists of 670 acres. It is located 13 miles east of Boerne off of State Highway 46 on Park Road 31 in Comal County. In the uplands away from the river, the limestone terrain is typical of the Edwards Plateau and has oak and juniper woodlands with interspersed grasslands. White-tailed deer populations exceed the carrying capacity of the area. Deer hunts were initiated in 1986 in an effort to protect the park's habitat.

Objectives of the department are to restore and maintain healthy populations of native fauna and flora in natural habitats and to provide for compatible public use. Where game populations exceed the carrying capacity of the habitat, the preferred method of reduction is public hunting.



## HUNTING INFORMATION

All park rules and regulations must be adhered to unless superseded by hunting regulations.

Permitted hunters should report to the Park headquarters by 9:30 a.m. to complete paperwork on the first day of their assigned hunt so they are ready for the 10 a.m. orientation. **Hunters must contact the area as soon as possible if they are unable to attend their accepted hunt. Additionally, only one orientation will be provided – failure to appear for the orientation will cause a forfeit of your hunt.**

**Standby positions are not guaranteed and are only available if there is an open slot following the second on-line draw or we receive a cancellation prior to 8 a.m. on the first morning of the hunt.** Potential standby hunters should report to the front gate of the park between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. on the first day of the desired hunt period to complete the application process. If available, the standby drawing will take place at 9 a.m. To reach the park entrance, take State Highway 46 approximately 8 miles west from the intersection of U.S. Highway 281 and State Highway 46, turn north (right) on Park Road 31 and go approximately 3 miles. The entrance is well marked. Orientation for each hunt begins promptly at 10 a.m. at the gazebo, located behind the headquarters building. Following the orientation, Texas Parks and Wildlife personnel will take hunters to their assigned blinds. Hunting will end at 10:00 a.m. on the final day of the assigned hunt.

Hunters must wear a minimum of **400 square inches of daylight fluorescent orange material**, with at least 144 square inches appearing on both chest and back and orange headwear.

Use of dogs is prohibited.

Legal weapons are specific to the hunt category – muzzleloader for adult hunt; center-fire rifle for youth hunts.

Non-permitted visitors and family members will not be allowed on the Park during hunts except that a non-hunting adult assisting a permitted handicapped hunter will be allowed.

Hunters will be responsible for the reasonable care of their game after harvest. No facilities for deer storage are available but a cleaning station is available at the Bauer Unit; commercial facilities are available in Boerne or New Braunfels.

Hunters are reminded that they must have a valid Texas Hunting License, and any required stamp as required by statute. It is no longer necessary to use a hunting license tag or bonus tag for on a deer taken during a Special Permit drawn hunt however a TPWD Legal Deer Tag, issued at the area, must be attached to a harvested deer prior to leaving the hunt area. Hunters 17 years of age and older must have in their possession a valid I.D. Hunter Safety Education is required of Texas hunters born on or after September 2, 1971 (see the Texas Parks and Wildlife Outdoor Annual for more information). Each hunter should also bring a flashlight, food, drinking water, a folding chair if you don't want to sit on a wooden bench, and foul weather gear. **Be prepared to hike up to ½ mile to your assigned blind.**

Disturbance or removal of plants, rocks, artifacts, or other objects is prohibited.

The public display or consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited. No hunter shall consume or be under the influence of alcohol while in the field hunting or on park property.

Hunters' vehicles will not be allowed into the hunt area, except that disabled individuals may hunt from a stationary motor vehicle. Operation of an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) or off-road vehicle (ORV) is prohibited, except by disabled persons or an adult directly assisting the permitted handicapped hunter.

Camping will be available on the Park for permitted hunters. Multi-purpose campsites with electricity, water, and tent pads will be available for use. Reservations are not required but will be accepted in advance by calling (512) 389-8900.

The normal overnight camping fee will be charged to those hunters using the Park's facilities. Adequate lodging is available in Boerne. For more information about the park call (830) 438-2656.
