



Nannie M. Stringfellow WMA E-Postcard Feral Hog

1. The APH feral hog hunt will be conducted from 11:00 am on Tuesday through end of shooting hours (30 minutes after sunset) on Thursday.
2. Hunters may begin check-in at the hunter check station at 10:00 am on the first day of each hunt period. A hunter orientation will follow before hunters will be allowed afield. A hunter orientation will begin on Tuesday at 11:00 am.
3. Unlimited hogs and coyotes may be harvested on this hunt.
4. Only persons drawn for permits will be allowed in the hunt area. Permitted non-hunting adults may supervise youths during any hunt but must possess a valid hunting license.
5. All hunters will be assigned blinds. Assignments will be made based on accessibility of the area, the type of vehicle the hunter will use to get there and the size of each hunt party.
6. Gun safety is a priority. Firearms must be unloaded during transportation to and from assigned compartments. Be sure of your target and what lies beyond that target.
7. All hunters must visibly wear a minimum of 400 square inches of hunter orange material with 144 inches appearing on both chest and back and orange headwear. A blaze orange vest and cap will meet requirements.
8. Hunters will be allowed limited use of their ATV to access the WMA. All vehicle travel will be restricted to designated road right-of-way.
9. Hunters with mobility disabilities may hunt from a stationary vehicle.
10. Baiting is allowed. Corn must be certified for livestock and wildlife consumption (tested for aflatoxin), no exceptions.
11. Alcohol is prohibited on the WMA.
12. Selected hunters must present the following:
 - a. Valid Texas hunting license.
 - b. Valid identification
 - c. Hunters education card - Required of Texas hunters born on or after September 2, 1971.
 - d. Annual Public Hunting Permit required for adults (youth hunters 16 years old and younger are free).

13. No camping or open fires are allowed on the WMA. Commercial facilities are available in Lake Jackson.
14. Do not litter on the WMA. Pick-up all personal and hunting-related litter.
15. Hunters in the field and vehicles on the WMA are subject to inspection by WMA personnel and game wardens.
16. Accommodations for hunters with disabilities on public hunt sites vary between areas. If you would like to request accommodation, please contact each area directly at least 2 weeks in advance of your hunt to discuss the options that may be available.
