



## **Nannie M. Stringfellow WMA E-Postcard Waterfowl**

1. Each E-postcard Waterfowl hunt will be conducted on mornings only for each specified hunt date. All hunters must be checked out and off the WMA by Noon.
2. Hunters will need to check-in at the hunter check station 2 hours before legal shooting time. A brief hunter orientation will follow before hunters will be allowed afield.
3. Seven hunt parties with a maximum of 4 hunters per party will be selected for each hunt date.
4. All hunters will be assigned hunt locations. Assignments will be made based on accessibility of the area and the type of vehicle the hunter will use to get there. Hunt groups may pick their hunt location in the order that they are drawn.
5. There are 4 moist soil units, 1 slough and a large swamp available to hunt.
6. Duck, geese, rail, snipe, sandhill crane, gallinule and dove (non-toxic shot only) may be taken provided the season is open for those species.
7. All hunters must check-in and checkout with Texas Parks and Wildlife Department personnel when going to and coming from assigned hunt compartments.
8. Hunters will be allowed limited use of their ATV to access the WMA. All vehicle travel will be restricted to designated road right-of-way.
9. Alcohol is prohibited on the WMA.
10. Hunters must possess a valid Texas hunting license, Hunters Education card (Required of Texas hunters born on or after September 2, 1971) and an Annual Public Hunting Permit.
11. No camping or open fires are allowed on the WMA. Commercial facilities are available in Lake Jackson, Bay City and West Columbia.
12. Do not litter on the WMA. Please pick-up all personal and hunting-related litter.
13. Hunters in the field and vehicles on the WMA are subject to inspection by WMA personnel and game wardens.
14. Accommodations for hunters with disabilities on public hunt sites vary between areas. If you would like to request accommodation, please contact each area directly at least 2 weeks in advance of your hunt to discuss the options that may be available.
