**Plants: The Foundation of Land Management** - Knowing your plants is basic to understanding how to manage your land effectively for multiple goals. Learn how to identify key plants important to livestock and various wildlife species.

Habitat Management Basics - Learn the basic tools for managing habitats for a variety of wildlife species.

Wildlife on Your Land (ID & Inventory) - Learn to "read your land" for wildlife using basic techniques for identifying animals and animal sign.
