

Expenditures for Restoration Work with Certain Wildlife Species

Through Period of 1938 - 1953

The above figures include expenditures for both research and development. They are incomplete because projects prior to 1946 were not restricted to a single species and accounting on a species basis is not feasible. Therefore, only such expenditures as can be isolated readily are presented.

The fact that no definite project funds are charged to a few species is somewhat misleading. For instance, every project set up in squirrel country from 1938 to 1945 involved some work with that species. Unfortunately, no record was made relative to the extent of such work, or the cost thereof. This also applies to other species, including the mourning dove.

Preceding comments to the contrary, the figures given above do indicate the trend in the relative scope of restoration efforts devoted to the species listed.
