## My emergency plan includes the following preventative measures:

- 1. Ensure all greenhouses containing water spinach are fully enclosed and secured.
- 2. Harvest and secure or apply herbicide to kill all water spinach in any greenhouse at risk of being damaged such that water spinach may escape.
- 3. Put all packages of water spinach in a dry, secure area.

Other measures I will take (if applicable):

## Immediately after the event, I will:

- 1. Inspect all my greenhouses and buffer zones. If any greenhouse is damaged, I will contact the department without delay at (512) 389-4742 and report the extent of any damage.
- 2. Search my entire property, including any ditches, creeks, or other water channels and the areas around my greenhouse(s) and packing area for escaped or scattered water spinach. I will remove or collect any water spinach I find that has escaped or become scattered and place it into a secure container or transport it to a secure waste or compost bin and compost it, dry it fully, or place it into black plastic bags prior to disposal.
- 3. Notify the department within 72 hours if I find water spinach outside of the greenhouse or buffer zone by calling (512) 389-4742.
- 4. Make repairs to my greenhouse(s) in a timely manner.
- 5. Ensure the buffer zones surrounding my greenhouse(s) and packing area are clear of any plants.

I understand that in the event of a hurricane, storm, flood, or other natural disaster or if the facility appears to be in imminent danger of flooding or release of water spinach into public water, I will implement this plan and notify the department by contacting the permit coordinator at 512-389-4742.
