



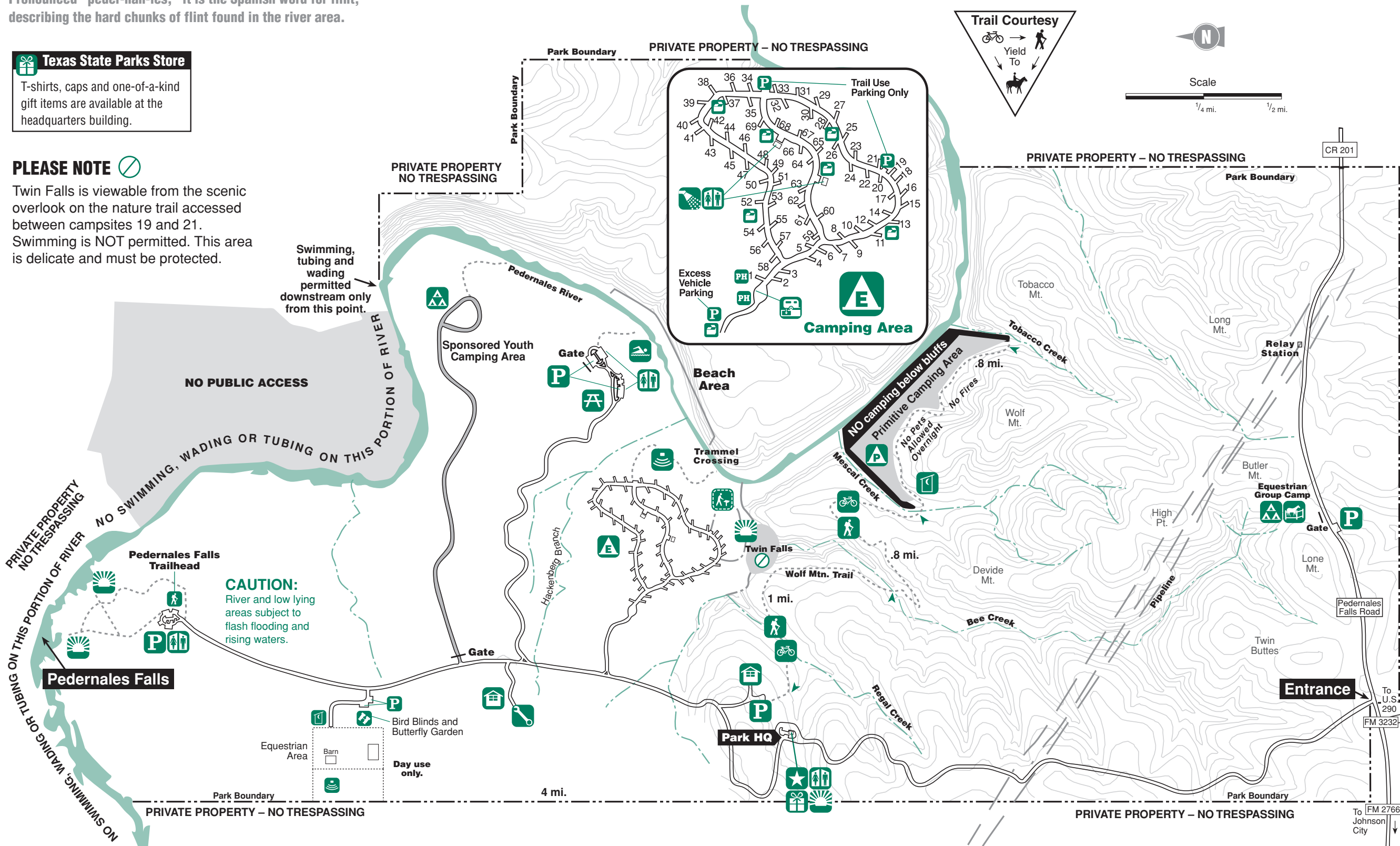
Pronounced "peder-nah-les," it is the Spanish word for flint, describing the hard chunks of flint found in the river area.
