

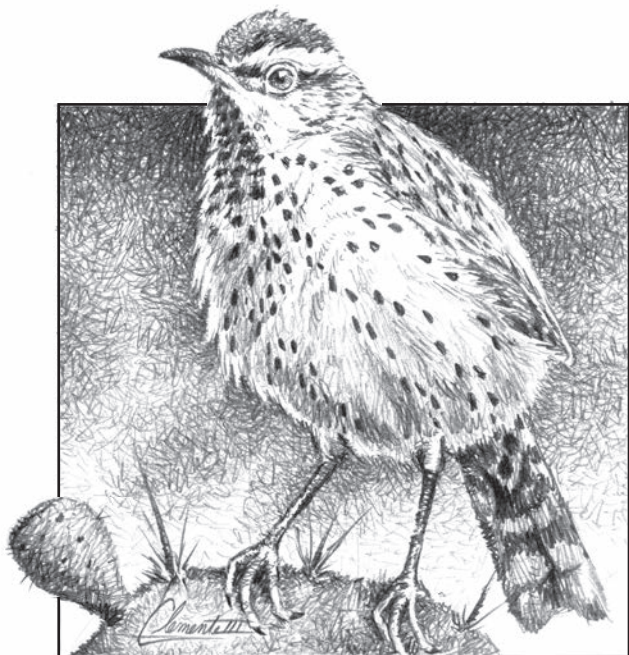

INTRODUCTION

San Angelo State Park occupies about 7,500 acres of land on the south, west and north shorelines of O. C. Fisher Lake adjacent to the northwest city limits of the City of San Angelo. The park sits astride the junction of four ecological zones: The High Plains to the north, the Edwards Plateau and Texas Hill Country to the south, the Rolling Plains to the east, and the arid Trans-Pecos and Chihuahuan Desert to the west. Consequently, the plant and animal life is highly diversified, including 251 species of birds and about 50 species of mammals. At present there are over 50 miles of trails with another 28 planned.

The habitat is primarily mesquite brushland with mesquite-juniper growth on the dry hillsides. There are stands of black willow along the waterline, and pecan trees along the river, particularly in the north end of the park. A few live oak trees may be found along the north end of the North Concho River. The hackberry is a very common tree in all sections of the park. A few wild plum exist in the draws and dry creek beds. The underbrush is primarily agarita, catclaw, white brush or bee-brush, lotebush, small leaf sumac and western soapberry. Yucca and sacahuista, also called basketgrass or bear grass, occur in the mesquite-juniper habitat. Bluestem is probably the most common of the grasses. All of the park is heavily infested with prickly-pear and tasajillo cactus. Extensive mud flats occur along the lake shore.

The birds on this checklist are from the records of many observers over many years of birding the O. C. Fisher Lake area, as well as many years of mist netting and banding birds at various sites in the park. Additional birds will probably be seen from time to time. Please enter sightings into eBird or return these reports to the park office.

Nomenclature and taxonomic order used in this checklist follow that of The American Ornithologists' Union *Check-List of North American Birds*, 7th Edition, 1998, and as supplemented.

This checklist was compiled by Delbert G. Tarter from the data collected over many years by many birders of the San Angelo area and by many park visitors. This edition includes updates by Mark Lockwood.

Please help us protect the natural avian communities in our parks by refraining from using playback tapes of bird songs. Frequent use of these tapes disrupts normal avian activity patterns, including essential territorial behavior, and may lead to nest failure. Thank you for your cooperation.

- C – common, easy to find most days
- U – uncommon, usually present, not easy to find
- O – occasional, probably present every year in low numbers; hard to find
- R – rare, not expected every year and in low numbers
- X – accidental, fewer than five occurrences within the state park
