With miles of freshwater shoreline and coastal beaches, to unique mountains, canyons and tall pine forests, Texas has something for just about everyone. The State Parks Pass is your ticket to see and experience it all, for 12 full months. It's the best – and for many, the most economical – way to enjoy everything you love about Texas.

If your family regularly travels to state parks with more than one vehicle, you may prefer the two-card membership, which provides you with an additional pass card for an additional fee. The secondary pass holder must reside at the same address as the primary pass holder. Secondary passes may only be purchased in-person at a park.

You can enjoy all of the hiking, fishing, relaxing and sight-seeing you want, and you'll get discounts on camping and state park store merchandise. For many, a pass pays for itself in just a few visits and also makes checking in to a park faster and easier.

As a Parks Pass holder you're eligible for special benefits:*

- Camping discounts
- Discount on state park store merchandise
- Reduced rates on equipment rentals

Parklands Passports

If you meet certain requirements you may qualify for a free Texas Parklands Passport. Unlike the annual pass, Parkland Passport benefits apply only to the pass holder, though benefits may be extended to one additional person to assist the pass holder. We offer four Parklands Passports:

- Senior Partial
- Senior Full
- Disabled Veterans
- Disability

For qualification requirements and a list of appropriate documentation visit [TexasStateParks.org/passes](https://texasstateparks.org/passes). Parklands Passports are only issued on-site at a Texas State Park.

Youth Group Annual Pass

This pass allows free entry to state parks for nonprofit youth group members and a reasonable number of adult sponsors. The pass is valid for one year and allows up to a combined total of 50 kids and sponsors to enter a park. To qualify for purchase, you must complete an application, provide proof of nonprofit status and certify that your group serves children ages 13 to 17. Price, application and instructions can be found at [TexasStateParks.org/passes](https://texasstateparks.org/passes). A completed application must be received at least six weeks before your next park visit.
