RECORDS BY WEIGHT

STATE RECORDS

Public Waters

Rod and Reel – Largest fish of a species caught from Texas public waters by any method of rod and reel fishing.

Fly Fishing – Largest fish of a species caught from Texas public waters by fly fishing methods using artificial flies.

Bow Fishing – Largest fish of a species caught from Texas public waters by bow fishing.

Other – Largest fish of a species caught from Texas public waters by any other legal method, excluding nets.

Private Waters

Rod and Reel – Largest fish of a species caught from Texas private waters by any method of rod and reel fishing.

Fly Fishing – Largest fish of a species caught from Texas private waters by fly fishing methods using artificial flies.

Bow Fishing – Largest fish of a species caught from Texas private waters by bow fishing.

WATER BODY RECORDS (public waters only)

Rod and Reel – Largest fish of a species caught from a particular Texas public water body by any method of rod and reel fishing.

Fly Fishing – Largest fish of a species caught from a particular Texas public water body by fly fishing methods using artificial flies.

Bow Fishing – Largest fish of a species caught from a particular Texas public water body by bow fishing.

All-Tackle – Largest fish of a species caught from a particular Texas public water body by any legal method, excluding nets.

RECORDS BY LENGTH

CATCH AND RELEASE RECORDS

Recognition for the catch and live release of the longest fish of a species from Texas public waters. State and water body records will be recognized.

Rod and Reel – Longest fish of a species caught by any method of rod and reel fishing.

Fly Fishing – Longest fish of a species caught by fly fishing methods using artificial flies.

1. Catch must meet or exceed minimum length for a Big Fish Award (see next column).
2. A witness to live release is required.
3. Measure the fish, take photos and return it to the water quickly. Weighing is optional.
4. Keep the fish in water as much as possible prior to release. Remove hook with pliers. Gently place the fish back into the water. Do not hang the fish on a stringer or gaff. If necessary, revive the fish by holding it upright in the water and facing it into the current, forcing water through its gills.

FIRST FISH AWARD

Recognition for the first fish caught by an angler of any age.

OUTSTANDING ANGLER

Any catch that does not meet requirements of other award categories but deserves recognition.

BIG FISH AWARD

Recognition for catching a trophy class fish of selected species. Catch must meet or exceed minimum length requirements.

A one-time achievement award for an angler who catches trophy class fish of five different species. To be eligible, an angler must earn five freshwater OR five saltwater Big Fish Awards.

1. Fish caught on or after May 1, 2004 will count toward Elite Angler status.
2. There is no time limit for catching the five trophy fish.

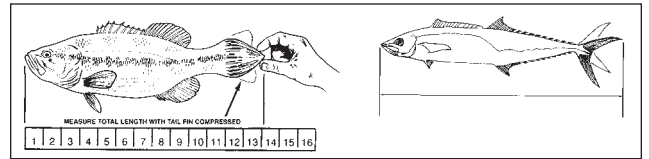

Length Measurements

1. Place fish on its side with the jaw closed.
2. Squeeze the tail fin together or turn it in a way to obtain the maximum overall length.
3. Measure a straight line from the tip of the snout to the extreme tip of the tail fin.



Photographs

1. Photographs are **required** for Catch and Release Record, State Record by Weight, Water Body Record and Big Fish Award applications. Photos of other outstanding catches are welcome. Video recordings will not be accepted in lieu of photographs.
2. Take clear, color, side-view photos from several different angles. One must clearly show the fish lying on its side with a ruler or other measuring device placed beside the fish. Another photo must show the angler with the fish. TPWD biologists will use the photos to identify the species for all records, and to verify length measurement for Big Fish Awards and Catch and Release Records.
3. Get close enough so that the image fills the frame. Make sure anal and dorsal fins are spread out and visible.
4. If the fish is a shark, photos of the teeth as well as photos of the head and back taken from above must be submitted along with the side-view photographs. The photo of head and back should clearly show whether a shark does or does not have a ridge between the dorsal fins.
5. Photos may be submitted by e-mail or mailed with the application. Submitted photos become the property of Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. High-quality photos may be chosen for display on the Angler Recognition website and at TPWD locations and events.

Species Verification

TPWD will not certify a State Record, Water Body Record, Catch and Release Record or Big Fish Award until the fish species is verified. If biologists are unable to make a conclusive identification from the photographs submitted, the angler will be asked to provide the fish for examination, and an affidavit of fish authenticity may be required.

Weight Record Applications

1. Fish must be at least 8 ounces (0.5 pounds) to be eligible for a weight record. **Exception:** For Junior Rod & Reel records, minimum weight is 2 ounces (0.125 pounds).
2. Fish must be weighed on certifiable or legal-for-trade scales within 3 days of the catch date. Scales are found in marinas, bait stores, feed mills, grocery stores and post offices. Visit our website for a list of Official Weigh Stations.
3. Certified scales are scales (either electronic or spring-based) that have been on an annual basis certified as accurate by a Texas Department of Agriculture Licensed Service Provider or the International Game Fish Association (IGFA.) If a non-certified scale is used, the applicant will have 30 days from the weighing date to have the scale certified.
4. The fish must not contain anything or have anything attached which artificially increases weight.
5. One or more disinterested witnesses must observe the weighing.

Fly Fishing Equipment

1. The lure must be a recognized type of artificial fly. A fly may be dressed on a single or double hook or two single hooks in tandem. Treble hooks are prohibited. The use of any other type of lure or natural or preserved bait, either singularly or attached to the fly, is prohibited. No scent, either natural or artificial is allowed on flies. The use of scented material in a fly is prohibited.
2. The rod, reel, line, and leader equipment used must be designed for fly fishing.
3. Casting and retrieving must be carried out in accordance with normal customs and generally accepted practices. The major criterion in casting is that the weight of the line must carry the lure rather than the weight of the lure carrying the line.

RULES FOR ALL AWARD CATEGORIES

1. For all award categories, the fish must be landed in Texas waters.
2. An Angler Recognition Award Application Form (PWD BR T3200-349B) completed by the angler must be received by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department within **60 days of the date of catch**. The 60-day limit will be waived for catches recognized as world records by the International Game Fish Association (IGFA).
3. The fish must be caught while obeying all laws or regulations governing the fish species and the waters in which it was caught.
4. Only one person may catch the fish (except for netting or gaffing the fish to bring it into the boat or onto shore).
5. The fish must not have contained anything (including electronics or other tagging devices) to assist in locating the fish.
6. Any deliberate falsification of any application will result in disqualification. All existing records will be removed and future applications from the angler will not be considered.
7. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department reserves the right to review, investigate, reject, disqualify, or accept any application submitted or any award granted. In cases of disputes, the decision of the Angler Recognition Awards Program Committee will be final.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department maintains the information collected through this form. With few exceptions, you are entitled to be informed about the information we collect. Under Sections 552.021 and 552.023 of the Texas Government Code, you are also entitled to receive and review the information. Under Section 559.004, you are also entitled to have this information corrected.
