Perched on a high divide, where the hill country meets West Texas, sits 6,300 acres of dramatic ridge tops and caverns. High overlooks and deep valleys cover the terrain. This rugged landscape sits at the intersection of three different ecoregions providing a unique environment of overlapping ecosystems. This creates habitat for abundant and varied animal life, including over 240 migratory and resident bird species and a colony of over 300,000 Mexican free-tailed bats. Wild caving tours explore the depths of Kickapoo Cavern, home of the largest cave formations in the state. Visitors can also enjoy camping, hiking, mountain biking, photography, and wildlife viewing.



Camping: RV and tent camping in the Indigo Creek Campground with drinking water, restrooms, and showers.



Picnicking: Tables and grills in Indigo Creek Day-Use Area.




Birdwatching: Rare Black-capped vireos, golden-cheeked warblers, and elf owls recorded here.



Tours: Wild cavern tours, bat flight programs, and birding walks. Call park for details.



Trails: 15 miles hike/bike trails through rugged country.



Located in Kinney and Edwards counties on Ranch Road 674, 21 miles north of Brackettville or 38 miles south of Rocksprings.
