## STATE PARK

Proof that dinosaurs once roamed the area lies within the bounds of Dinosaur Valley State Park. Over the course of thousands of years, the meandering Paluxy River has worn down its streambed to expose a number of dinosaur tracks originally made some 113 million years ago. Excellent educational exhibits feature the dinosaur trackmakers at the park. Opportunities for camping, hiking and nature study are also available.



**Interpretive Center:** Exhibits about the tracks and the dinosaurs that made them.



**Special Feature:** Two gigantic life-size statues of dinosaurs at park entry. Authentic dinosaur tracks along river bed; check on river conditions for track visibility.



**Camping:** Campsites with water and electricity. Also primitive (backpacking) camping sites.



**Group Facilities:** Rustic group picnic pavilion (25 people).



**Picnicking:** Picnic tables and grills.



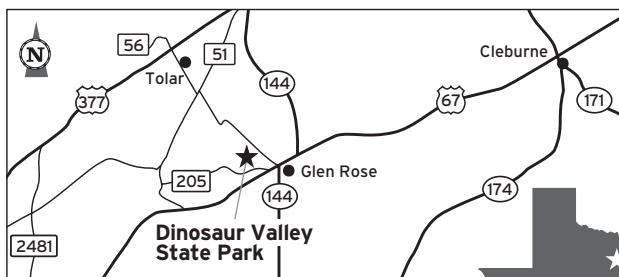
**Swimming:** Permitted in the Paluxy River.



**Trails:** 17-mile trail system includes hiking, biking and equestrian trails.



**Texas State Parks Store:** Gifts, books and more.
