Sunshine, surf and sand combine to create one of the state's most popular places — Galveston Island State Park on the Gulf Coast. Here, visitors can choose from a variety of activities, such as swimming, fishing, hiking and birdwatching. Anglers can try their luck along the shore, bayous and coves, or cast a line for freshwater species in the park's ponds. Birders will appreciate observation platforms and blinds along the nature trail.

Camping: Beach and bay side campsites with water and electricity.

Historic Homes: Two restored homes on Galveston Bay with multiple beds, full kitchen, multiple restrooms, plus private drive and yard.


Picnicking: Picnic tables with shade shelters and grills.

Swimming: At your own risk on the beach. Rinse showers.

Fishing: Excellent fishing and crabbing along the shore, bayous and coves. Fish cleaning station.

Birdwatching: Over 300 species recorded.

Trails: Four miles of hiking and biking trails, plus observation platforms and boardwalks. Nine miles of paddling trails with easy access to Galveston Bay.
