In the early 1800s, Stephen F. Austin brought the first 297 families to colonize Texas, and they settled here, on the banks of the Brazos River. The park and nearby San Felipe de Austin State Historic Site mark part of the original land granted by the Mexican government. The park also provides an opportunity to get up close to nature. Come out for just a day and enjoy the many hiking and biking trails, fishing in the Brazos River, the picnic area, or spend the night, with a wide variety of campsites. The park also offers group facilities, for day or overnight use.



Camping: Walk-in campsites (no electricity); campsites with water only; pull-through sites with full hook-ups; screen shelters; limited service cabins; group campsite (capacity 60).



Group Facilities: Dining hall (capacity 60); overnight group hall (screened facility - capacity 60); group lodge (capacity 26).



Picnicking: Picnic tables and grills.



Recreation: Swing set, volleyball and basketball court.



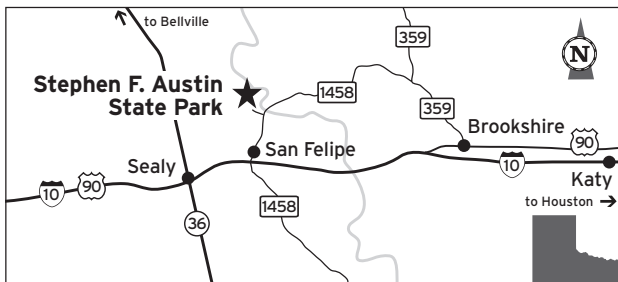
Fishing: At the river. Accessible by hiking trail only.



Trails: 6 miles of hiking and biking trails.



Texas State Parks Store: Unique items, gifts, etc.



Located in Austin County, 3 miles east of Sealy on I-10 to F.M. 1458, then north 2.5 miles to Park Road 38.
