Gulf Coast beaches and marshlands provide the backdrop for Sea Rim State Park. Visitors can sunbathe, swim or surf fish at the Beach Unit, location of the park's headquarters. From the Marshlands Unit, visitors may explore the marsh estuaries by canoe or kayak. An abundance of birds and other wildlife, notably the American alligator, inhabits the marsh wetlands. Birdwatching is popular in the park, especially in the spring and fall.



Camping: Campsites with water and electricity; primitive camping on East and West Beach.



Picnicking: Tables and grills in Blue Crab day-use loop.



Swimming: In Gulf of Mexico (no lifeguard provided).



Fishing: Fishing in the Gulf; possible catches include red and black drum, southern flounder and speckled trout. Fishing in the marsh by shallow draft boat only; boat ramp provided.



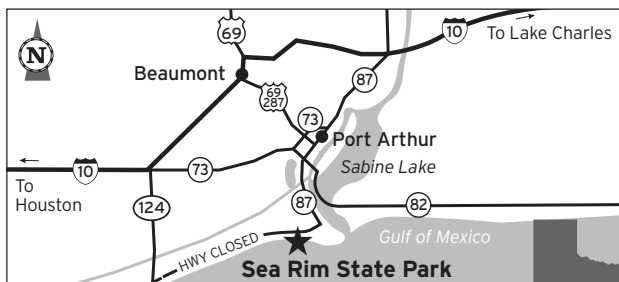
Boating: Boat ramp at Marshlands Unit. Over 10 miles of paddling trails in marsh.



Birdwatching: Over 290 species of birds at various times of the year; spring migration is most popular.



Trails: 3/4-mile marsh boardwalk trail. 5.2 miles of beach for mountain biking. Over 10 miles of paddling trails in marsh.



Located in Jefferson County, 10 miles west of the town of Sabine Pass on Texas Hwy. 87. Hwy. 87 is closed between Sea Rim and High Island.
