Canoeing and hiking are the main recreational themes at Village Creek State Park. Village Creek, a clean, sand-bottomed, free-flowing tributary of the Neches River, is one of Texas' high-quality canoe float streams. The park is sited on the meandering lower reaches of the creek and its ecology mirrors that of the Texas Big Thicket. The area's beauty can be experienced along the park's miles of hiking and mountain biking trails winding through various ecosystems and along the creekbank while under the deep shade of the forest canopy.



Camping: Back-in campsites with water and electricity. Also walk-in tent camping area.



Cabin: Furnished, climate-controlled (capacity 8).



Group Facilities: Group picnic pavilion (capacity 100); youth group campground (capacity 50).



Picnicking: Picnic sites with tables and grills.



Swimming: Allowed at park sandbar – a one-mile hike.



Birdwatching: Most bird species typical of the Big Thicket area.



Canoeing: 40 miles of canoeing available on Village Creek. Canoe and kayak rentals and transportation from local outfitters.




Fishing: Catfish, bass, crappie, bluegill, panfish.



Trails: 10 miles of deep-shade hiking and mountain biking trails.



Texas State Parks Store: One-of-a-kind items, books, etc.



Located in Hardin County; from I-10, north on U.S. Hwy. 69, 10 miles into Lumberton, take Mitchell Rd. exit, then watch for directional signs. Located off Alma Dr.
