Step into 1850 as you explore the original home of Dr. Anson Jones, the last president of the Republic of Texas. The home is the centerpiece of Barrington Living History Farm, where the Jones family lived for over a decade building a successful cotton farm after Texas joined the Union. Today, using Anson's daybooks and accounts as their guide, the costumed interpreters follow the seasons for planting, cultivating, harvesting and working with livestock. Chores are plentiful on a working farm, so you are welcome to lend a hand if you'd like.



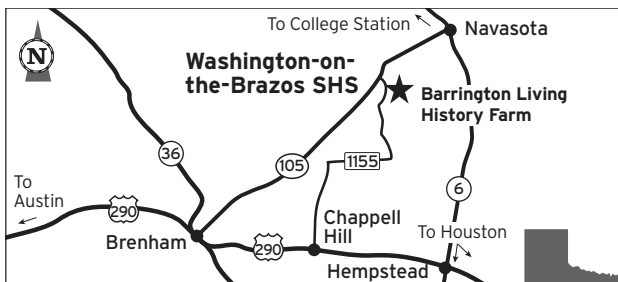

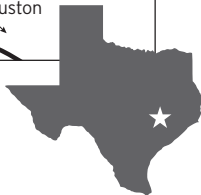
Special Events: Seasonal hands-on farm activities throughout the year. Visit website for details.
