


Rustic facilities, miles of shoreline and abundant wildlife attract visitors each year to Lake Brownwood State Park. The 7,300-acre reservoir is big enough for swimming, fishing, boating and skiing. Several trails allow outdoor lovers to get close to nature. In the 1930s, the Civilian Conservation Corps built the park's roads, cabins and the popular recreation hall, which sits on a hilltop overlooking the lake and surrounding hills.



Camping: Campsites with water in the area, water and electricity, or full hookups. Also screened shelters.



Cabins: Sixteen 2- or 4-person cabins with kitchen and bathroom.



Group Facilities: Four group lodges (capacity 4, 8, 10 and 26). Group dining hall (day-use capacity 70). Recreation hall (day-use capacity 80).



Picnicking: Picnic tables and grills; some overlook lake.



Swimming: Designated swimming beach with bathhouse.



Boating: Boat ramp and dock. Also water skiing.



Fishing: Lighted fishing pier, crappie dock, and fish-cleaning station.



Trails: 5.5 miles of hiking, biking, and interpretive trails.



Located in Brown County; from Brownwood, 16 miles northwest on Texas 279 then east on Park Road 15 for six miles.
