Clear, blue water and more than 300 miles of shoreline with many scenic coves attract thousands of people each year to Possum Kingdom State Park. Here visitors can swim, boat, fish, ski, scuba dive and snorkel in Possum Kingdom Lake, located on the edge of a hilly area of North Texas known as the Palo Pinto Mountains. White-tailed deer and other wildlife, such as rabbits, raccoons and, of course, opossums, inhabit the park.



Camping: Campsites with water only or water/electricity. Primitive sites. Reservations advised.



Cabins: Six cabins (capacity 4). One cabin (capacity 8). Reservations advised.



Picnicking: Picnic tables and grills in a sheltered cove and also near swimming beach.



Swimming: Designated swimming area (no lifeguard).



Fishing: Lighted fishing pier. Possible catches include catfish, bass, black bass, striped bass, crappie and perch.



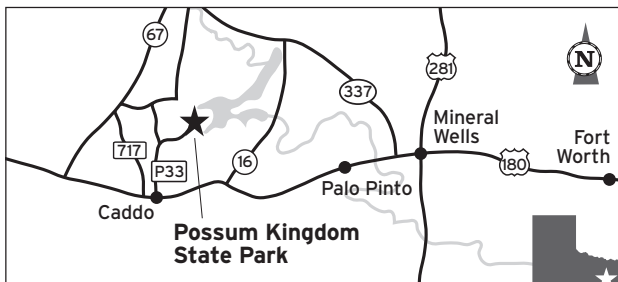
Boating: Boat ramp and dock. Also skiing on lake.



Trails: One-mile hiking trail.



Concession: Groceries, ice, fishing bait and seasonal rental of boats, souvenirs, firewood, boat slips, vehicle and motorboat fuel.



Located in Palo Pinto County, 17 miles north of Caddo on Park Road 33.
