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Hidden among steep hillsides and sheltered canyons, Palo Pinto Mountains State Park offers a peaceful retreat with over 12 miles of trails for hiking, biking and horseback riding. Located halfway between Fort Worth and Abilene, this rugged landscape features winding creeks, limestone ridges and expansive vistas. Tucker Lake, the park's centerpiece, invites visitors to fish, swim and kayak in its tranquil waters. Wildlife flourishes in this diverse environment, with sightings of deer, wild turkey and the endangered golden-cheeked warbler. Whether you're camping under the stars or exploring the scenic trails, Palo Pinto Mountains State Park offers endless adventure and exploration.



Camping: RV sites, walk-in tent sites, primitive and equestrian camping areas.



Fishing: Limited to 5 of any species. Fishing permitted in Tucker Lake, Palo Pinto Creek or Russell Creek. ADA accessible fishing pier.



Stargazing: View the night sky across expansive vistas.



Paddling: Kayaking, canoeing and paddleboarding. ADA accessible kayak launch.



Birdwatching: Wide variety of songbirds, red-tailed hawks, great blue herons and more. Ask for a birding checklist.



Trails (Hiking, Mountain Biking & Horseback): Over 12 miles of multiuse trails, including a 1-mile accessible trail.



Picnicking: Picnic areas and accessible playground features.



Located in Palo Pinto and Stephens counties, near Strawn; 75 miles west of the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex.
