South Llano River State Park

Two miles of the South Llano River borders South Llano River State Park, located in the Texas Hill Country near Junction. The river's cool, clear waters attract visitors who enjoy swimming, tubing, canoeing and fishing. Wild turkeys frequent the park all year and, in the winter, congregate there to roost. The park's easy hiking trails allow hikers and mountain bikers to explore the open woodland, river bank and two small oxbow lakes.



Camping: walk-in sites with water available and sites with water and electricity.



Picnicking: picnic area near river.



Swimming: permitted in river. No lifeguards.



Fishing: in the river or a small oxbow lake.



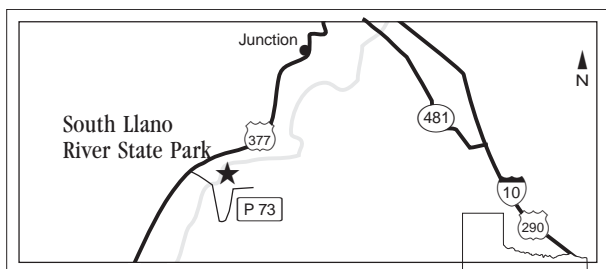
Canoeing and Tubing: numerous access points on river. Canoe and tube rentals available nearby.



Wildlife Observation: blinds offer excellent birding and wildlife viewing opportunities. Bottomland of park closes from October 1 to April 1 each year to protect turkey roost.



Trails: several hiking trails lead into adjoining Walter Buck Wildlife Management Area. Also suitable for mountain bikes.



Located in Kimble County, five miles south of Junction, off U.S. 377 on Park Road 73.
