Located less than 90 minutes from Austin, Longhorn Cavern State Park is a unique Hill Country destination full of natural beauty and Texas-sized tales. Developed in the 1930s by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), the park's star attraction is Longhorn Cavern, an underground wonder created by the dissolving and cutting action of an ancient river. Enjoy a guided cave tour, hike a trail, and admire some of Texas' best examples of historic CCC architecture.

Gift Shop: Unique themed apparel and souvenirs.



Snack Bar: Pizza, snacks, cold drinks and frozen treats.

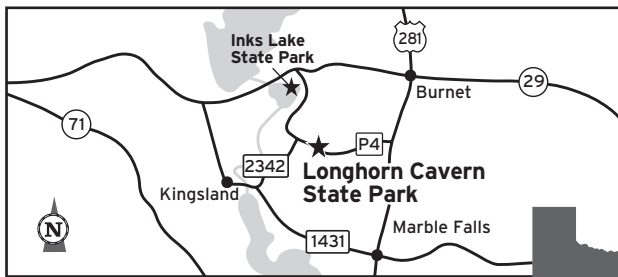


Picnicking: Shaded tables.



Trails: 1 1/4 miles of hiking trails through scenic oak-juniper and karst landscapes.

Access to the park grounds, including hiking trails, picnic area, and historic CCC buildings is FREE during regular business hours. Cave admission is by paid guided tour only. Day-use only park; no overnight camping available. Nearest state park campground is at Inks Lake State Park, six miles away on Park Road 4.



Located in Burnet County, six miles west of U.S. Hwy. 281, on Park Road 4.
