STATE PARK AND HISTORIC SITE

Lyndon B. Johnson State Park and Historic Site in Central Texas offers a variety of outstanding activities. The park provides exhibits detailing the life of the President and serves as a reception point for tours of the LBJ Ranch and LBJ Birthplace which are maintained by the National Park Service. A unique attraction at the park is an authentic working farm, where park interpreters dress in period costumes, demonstrating the lifestyles of a typical Hill Country farm between 1915 and 1918. The park is famous for its seasonal wildflowers and rates as a premiere destination for photographers. The many cultural features are complemented by numerous natural attractions such as enclosures with bison, longhorn cattle and white-tailed deer.



Tours: Self-guided tours of LBJ State Park and LBJ Ranch.



Historic Structures and Farm: Restored dogtrot cabins and the Sauer-Beckmann Living History Farm.



Trails and Special Attractions: Nature trail, wildflower displays, fenced animal exhibits.



Visitor Center: Film and slide presentations, ranger talks and interpretive exhibits.



Picnicking: Shaded sites, some roofed, near playgrounds and the farm.



Recreational Complex: Swimming pool w/bathhouse, pavilion, tennis courts and baseball field.



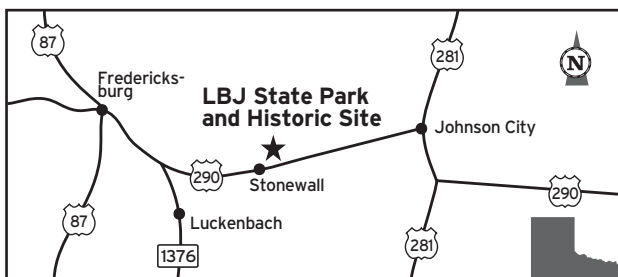
Fishing: Available in the Pedernales River.



Group Facilities: Dining Hall w/full kitchen (seats 80) and open-air Group Picnic Area (seats 200).
