



#### <u>Incident profile over time:</u>

- Incidents were highly preventable thru proper training
- Over half had not completed hunter education training
- Victims were not wearing hunter orange clothing
- Most incidents were due to lack of hunter judgment
- Most shooters had over 10 years of hunting experience
- Most shooters were <u>not</u> under the influence of alcohol
- If self-inflicted, shooters handled firearms carelessly
- Distance of muzzle to wound was generally under 15 yards
- Incident occurred towards dusk; fatigue a possible factor

### Significant for 2016

- 10 (42%) incidents were caused by swinging on game outside of a SAFE ZONE OF FIRE, MOVING INTO LINE OF FIRE or being OUT OF SIGHT OF SHOOTER
- A rise in fatal incidents (5) occurred in 2016; two (2) victims that were MISTAKEN FOR GAME (hog, exotics)
- CARELESS HANDLING led the list on incidents (6) in 2016 due to pointing firearm in unsafe direction
- DOVE hunting with 7 continued to (29%) lead the list of animals hunted at time of incidents; quail up to 4 in 2016
- Regarding equipment used, SHOTGUNS continue to be the dominant firearm involved in hunting incidents
- Under half (10) were HUNTER EDUCATION graduates
- 3 (13%) shooters completed ONLINE-ONLY Hunter Ed.
- 2 (8%) incidents involved ALCOHOL use, and 5 (21%) involved LAW VIOLATIONS, slightly up in 2016

<u>C. Non-Hunting Related</u> - Other reported accidents/incidents resulting from the discharge of a firearm/bow, which causes the injury or death of any person(s), other than while hunting (reported to TPWD Game Wardens)
