TEXAS HUNTING INCIDENT PROFILE

- Violated a cardinal rule of hunter safety incidents were preventable
- Average age in the twenties
- Hunted deer with rifle; hog with handgun/rifle; or dove/quail with shotgun
- Was **not** under the influence of alcohol
- Did not attend a hunter education (safety) course or program
- Did not wear any type of hunter orange clothing
- Was situated in or around vehicle
- Sustained a non-fatal injury

- If not self-inflicted incident was a caused by lack of judgment or skill
- Had over 10 years of hunting experience
- If self-inflicted handled firearm carelessly; firearm fell
- Distance of muzzle to wound was within 50 yards, mostly within 10 yards
- Victim was in light to open cover with clear visibility (weather)
- Incident occurred towards dusk; fatigue a factor
- Incident occurred on weekend during September or November



2012 Significant Factors

- Fatalities up by three from 2011
- Swinging on Game incidents up from 2011
- Dove incidents at four-year high
- Incidents involving those under 40 up from 2010 and 2011
- Fewer hunter education graduates in the incident data
- Self-inflicted accidents down significantly
- Number of alcohol incidents down
