How did being the son of a Texas Game Warden effect your decision to pursue a career as a warden?

I remember making my career decision to become a game warden when I was in the third grade. Even at that young age I knew my dad was in a unique law enforcement field and I greatly admired his work. I did not have to be encouraged to follow his path because I got to see first-hand the benefits a game warden career provided for my family, which solidified my decision. When I became a warden I modeled my work ethic after my father's. He had a subtle way of gaining respect from people in a dignified manner. After 32 years in the field he hung his hat up and retired. I feel blessed to be able to continue the tradition as a lifelong member of the Texas Game Warden family.
