

## TEXAS GAME WARDEN Recruiter's Corner November 2016



Career FAQ's (Related to Duty Station)

**Do I get to choose my first duty station assignment upon graduating from the Texas Game Warden Academy?** Duty station assignments are made where vacancies exist statewide and shall be made in the best interest of the department. Cadets are given a list of available duty stations near their graduation date from which they can submit a preference. However, there is no guarantee the cadet will receive their personal request.

*How long must I stay at my first duty station before I qualify for a duty station transfer?* To qualify for a duty station transfer game wardens must stay at their duty station for a minimum of one year and must have received a satisfactory performance evaluation from the preceding fiscal year.

How are game wardens selected for a transfer of duty station when there are *multiple requests?* Transfers are granted based on a wardens good standing (performance review) and their tenure within the department. When there are wardens from the same graduating class requesting the same duty station, other performance factors can be considered.
