

Career FAQ (Game Warden/Landowner Relations)

Why is it important for Texas Game Wardens to maintain relationships with their local landowners? A good working relationship allows wardens the ability to easily access property where a person is engaged in hunting or fishing activities, and gives wardens the ability to more readily handle complaints of trespassing or hunting without landowner consent. A good relationship can also help with the improvement of wildlife management and provides landowners the ability to become better stewards of their land. A trustworthy rapport opens the lines of communication for questions, feedback and the reporting of illegal activity. Additionally, a principled relationship can lead to other outreach opportunities for landowners and wardens to take local youth hunting and fishing on private property. Texas landowners are valued members in the fight against wildlife crime and they greatly contribute toward the effective work of a Texas Game Warden.
